5. About the College

Canara College, established in 1973 is being managed by Canara High School Association, along with fourteen other educational institutions.

On 12th July 1972, Dr. A.P. Pai, a respected and Senior Life member of the College Committee laid the foundation stone of the college building. The College is highly indebted to its past President, the late U. Gopalkrishna Nayak, an ardent educationist, who was instrumental in the construction of the new buildings for the three high schools, junior College and the present First Grade College as well. The college was declared open on the 4th of July 1973 - by Mr. Holck Larsen, the then Chairman & Managing Director of Larsen & Toubro Ltd.

The college provides the three-year degree course in Science, Commerce and Management and Computer Application to men and women students without distinction of caste or creed. On account of well qualified teaching faculty and remarkable results in the University Examinations, the college has been recognised and identified as a premier institution in the combined districts of Dakshina Kannada and Udupi.

A majestic and spacious building was put up at a cost of about Rs. 8 lakhs in 1973 with all modern facilities to impart college education of the highest standard. Spacious laboratories have been constructed in the Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Computer Science. These are renovated & reshaped in the new building to suit the need of the hour.

The College aims not merely at providing University education but also equipping the students to face the challenges of life. The College lays great stress on the development of character and discipline among the young students so that they may turn out to be worthy citizens of our country.

The college also provides facilities for co-curricular and extra curricular activities and the students are encouraged to participate in them. The Staff of the College are always ready to provide the necessary guidance to the students in making their academic life wholesome and interesting.

6. Laurels all the Way

Since the year 1976 Canara College has been securing not only good results but also ranks. Our Alumni can be seen in executive positions in leading financial institutions in India and abroad. Some of them are doing research in leading scientific laboratories of international repute. Many among them have made a name in the field of Journalism, Literature and in Social service.

We are indeed proud that our college has attracted many reputed companies like Infosys, Wipro, Dell, Deustch Bank etc. for campus interviews for the past few years. Every year the number of companies conducting campus interviews are on the increase. At the same time the number of students getting placements has also increased considerably.

Expansion

Today, Canara College has been recognised and identified as a premier institution in the combined district of Dakshina Kannada and Udupi. The rush for admission in the college induced the management to expand in different fields of studies and an additional section was introduced in Commerce with computer Application as an option in 1996 and BCA course was started in 2001. Ph.D. Programme in Sanskrit was started in 2002. These additional courses forced the expansion of our infrastructure for housing Computer, Laboratory, Library and Reading Room and additional class rooms. This required large funds exceeding a crore of rupees. As in the past, the bountiful grace of Providence once again came to the rescue of the C.H.S. Association in meeting the cost of the expansion. A large-hearted response from an alumnus of our mother institution, Late Sri G. Sanjeeva Shenoy of Bombay, who came with a munificent donation of Rs. 1 crore saved the situation. The Foundation Stone for a five storeyed building facing M.G. Road was laid by the donor on the Founder's Day, 19th November 1995 and the building was inaugurated on 9th June, 1997.

Our Management has spread its wings of expansion, by including Business Management Course. Understanding the requirement and demand in the job market, the management has introduced BBM course from academic year 2007-08.

The Post-Graduate centre has been established and Post Graduate course in commerce has commenced from the academic year 2012-13.

Fee Schedule

1. Every student shall be liable to pay the fees for the whole term at the time of admission.
2. If a student fails to pay his fees on the day fixed for the purpose in the calendar, he/she shall have to pay a fine at the rate of 0-50 P. per day. If the fee together with the fine is not paid within the last day for the fees collection with fines, the student's name shall be removed from the rolls. He/She will be re-admitted only after he/she pays all his/her arrears including fines and the re-admission fees.
3. The fees must be paid in cash in the College office during the working hours: 9-30 a.m. to 12-30 p.m. on working days other than Saturday, and 9.30 a.m. to 10-30 a.m. on Saturdays.
4. A receipt signed by the Principal or his authorised person shall be issued for all payments.

Identity Cards

Each student of this College is expected to possess an identity card with his/her photo affixed on it duly attested by the Principal. They are advised to keep the card with them always and use them on the appropriate occasions.

Junior students of the College are asked to meet their respective Academic Advisors for getting them; and the senior students are asked to get their identity cards renewed by their respective Academic Advisors.

11. Code of Conduct for Students

1. Be courteous to all and at all times.
2. Maintain highest standards of behaviour both inside and outside the College.
3. Treat College property as your own.
4. Remember that University education is a high privilege and it demands hard work, devotion and sincerity.
5. Maintain and uphold the dignity and fair name of the College in every possible way.

12. Discipline

DRESS CODE : UNIFORM

Students shall wear uniform as specified by the college on all working days in a week, days of examination and national days.

Dress code for boys :

Boys are not allowed to

- Wear caps, scarves and other fashion accessories
- Grow long hair, and flaunt fancy hairstyle and beard
- Shave heads, wear ear rings.

Dress code for Girls :

Lady students are not allowed to

- Alter the uniform in any manner
- Attend classes with dark lips and coloured hair
- Let their hair loose

Parents are asked to co-operate in making these norms acceptable to students by encouraging them to understand the dress ethics.

Cell phones / Mobile phones are strictly prohibited in the College campus. If students are found using Cell phones in the campus, such cell phones will be seized and are fined and not returned to students.

(a) General : Ragging

1. Ragging in the College campus is strictly forbidden. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the college authority the concerned student shall be expelled from the college after conducting an enquiry if the student is found guilty.
2. Every student is expected to salute the members of the staff when he/she meets them on the first occasion of the day.
3. The morning session will begin with a prayer. At the prayer bell, all students will stand up in their respective classes for the duration of the prayer.
4. Each class or a batch of students will be in the charge of an Academic Advisor who will keep a close watch over the attendance, progress and conduct of the students.

5. Students are strictly prohibited from smoking in the premises of the College or in the playgrounds. They are also strongly advised not to smoke in the streets or in any place.
6. Irregular attendance, habitual late coming, discourtesy towards lecturers and other staff, and continued inefficiency or indifference to College work, obscenity in word or act, damaging College property, participation in agitational activities, misconduct, strikes etc. are sufficient reasons for punishment by the Principal like suspension from the College, withholding of scholarships and freeships, imposition of fine, censure etc. including dismissal from the College or refusal of admission in the succeeding year.
7. Wilful damage to the property of the College books, furniture, water, gas and electrical installations etc., will have to be paid for. In case of damage to college property, the cost of repair and any other charges will be collected from the student or students known to him, immediately concerned. But if the persons who caused damage are unknown, the cost of repair etc. may be collected equally from all the students in the college. The decision of the Principal is final in all these matters.
8. While the College does not hold itself responsible for conduct outside its premises, the Principal may take cognisance of any serious misconduct outside which is likely to reflect upon the reputation of the College, and take such action against the offender's he deems fit and proper. Such students may be refused readmission after the end of the year.
9. No student shall be allowed to take part in any political activities and there shall be no political or other demonstrations and strikes of any kind within the College premises or outside directed against established authority or on behalf of any political or other group. Students engaged in such activities are liable to be dismissed.
10. Unauthorised books / magazines are not to be brought to the College.
11. Students who do not live with their parents or guardians must live in a Hostel or in lodging approved by the Principal.

12. No meeting shall be convened, no person shall be invited to address the students, no publication shall be issued without the permission of the Principal.
13. Students of the College are not allowed to play in any outside team without the Principal's permission.
14. The Principal, in consultation with the Staff Council, shall have the power to rusticate any student from the College, if in the opinion of the Council, his continuation in the College is not desirable in the interest of discipline in the College.
15. The rules of behaviour in the laboratory is published in the departmental notice board at the beginning of the academic year. Students are expected to strictly abide by the rules.

b. To Parents and Guardians :

1. Parents and guardians are earnestly requested to keep in touch with the Principal from time to time regarding the progress and conduct of their wards, and to meet the Principal atleast once a term to ascertain the progress and conduct of their wards.
2. Parents and guardians are particularly requested to see that their wards reside in proper lodgings approved by the Principal and keep themselves in touch with the students from time to time.
3. While every effort will be made to inform the parents or guardians about any instance of serious misconduct on the part of their ward, the authorities of the College do not bind themselves to intimate in advance to the parent or guardian any action which they are compelled to take either during the year or at the end of the year against the student in the best interest of the tone and discipline of the College.
4. Parents are reminded that they are not absolved of their responsibility once their sons/daughters are admitted to the college. The college expects parents or guardians to co-operate with the college authorities in the education of their children. They should follow the student's progress in studies and his/her general conduct in and outside the college. Their co-operation is solicited especially to ensure regular attendance of classes.

c. In the class-room :

1. Students are not allowed to loiter about in the premises of the College during working hours. Leisure hours must be spent either in the library or reading room in quiet study. Students should move from one classroom to another in an orderly and disciplined manner. All movements in the College must conform to the standard of academic decorum and dignity.
2. The college timings are as follows :
Morning : 9-20 a.m. to 12-25 p.m.
Afternoon : 1-15 p.m. to 4-10 p.m.
3. Students should note the following schedule of bells :

9.20 First Bell : This bell rings to get the students into the classes.

9.25 Second Bell : This bell rings to bring the teacher to the Classroom

9.28 Third Bell : This bell is for the college Prayer.

9.30 Fourth Bell : The Classes will commence.



Disciplinary Rules

The Disciplinary Rules for the students of affiliated colleges framed by the University were approved by the Syndicate at its meeting dated 9-8-1984, and communicated to the colleges in the Notification No. MU/ACC/A3/MISC/13/84-85 dated 13-9-1984.

As per the rules, the following will constitute acts of indiscipline:

- a. **Minor acts of indiscipline :** Causing disturbance within the college premises, Laboratory or Reading Room, Common room, or playground; diverting the attention of the students from the Lectures or of the Lecturers from teaching, insubordination and disrespect to the Lecturers, within or outside the College premises, habitual distraction to class work, disturbing class from outside, loitering aimlessly in the corridors, making noise and disturbing the classes, picking up quarrel with the staff, teaching or non-teaching, or with other students and any other act or acts which the Principal may deem as minor act or acts of indiscipline.
- b. **Major acts of indiscipline :** Repetition of minor acts of indiscipline in spite of repeated warnings and penalties imposed; attending the college without prescribed uniform or dressed in a manner contrary to social norms prevailing from time to time; indecent exposure in a provocative manner, behaving in a manner tending to rouse baser passions among the members of the same or opposite sex; disfiguring the walls, floors, furniture etc. of the College, by writing offensive and indecent slogans; wanton destruction of College properties, instigating others to commit acts of indiscipline; organisation of movements subversive of discipline of the College; physical intimidation of law abiding students; indulging in criminal acts of any kind a rousing communal and caste feelings among students; demonstration of disloyalty to the country, its Constitution and its flag. ragging of any kind tending to cause physical and mental torture to other students, or forcing others to submit to indignity and nuisance, playing in matches against the officially sponsored team of the College, attending the College in a drunken state and indulging in unseemly behaviour, using opiates of any kind, bringing to the College whistles, drums, blow pipes and such other instruments with the intention of creating noise and disturbing the peace of the college; smoking and consumption of tobacco in any form within the College campus, bringing and playing cassettes or tuning radios inside the class or outside during class hours and any other act or acts which the Principal considers as major acts of indiscipline. No relaxation in disciplinary rules will be allowed **for any reason.**

Nature of penalties and authorities empowered to impose them:

2. Penalties for major acts of indiscipline :	Authority empowered to impose them
(a)	(b)
(i) Suspension from College	Principal
(ii) Asking the parent to withdraw the Student from the College	Principal
(iii) Rustication from the College	University Syndicate on the recommendations of the Vice Chancellor after considering the report of the Principal.

The college will follow the procedure in imposing penalties on the students as per the procedure laid down under chapter II of the Disciplinary Rules.

Acts of indiscipline / misconduct outside the College campus :

- (i) The Principal shall not ordinarily take cognisance of act/acts of indiscipline committed by a student outside the College campus.
- (ii) But if he receives intimation in writing from the authorities of law and order or magistrate regarding arrest and detention of a student on a charge of criminal act/acts committed outside the College, the Principal shall place him under suspension until he is released on bail or otherwise.
- (iii) If the Principal is informed in writing by the authorities of law and order or a magistrate that a student of the College has been convicted to imprisonment for an offence inviting moral turpitude, the Principal shall, in addition to placing him under suspension at once, report the matter to the Vice-chancellor.
- (iv) The Vice-Chancellor shall place the matter before the Syndicate which shall rusticate him from the College.
- (v) If on appeal the conviction is set aside, his rustication shall ipso facto cease and the Principal shall report the same to the University.

13. Attendance :

1. Students should attend classes regularly.
2. Absence from the class should properly be accounted for in the Leave record.
3. Attendance is taken every hour at the commencement of the class.
4. Leave is noted/sanctioned by appropriate authority as indicated separately on the Leave Record Form. No student is allowed to attend the classes on the subsequent day unless leave has been noted/sanctioned by appropriate authority.

5. The Leave Notes should be presented in the prescribed forms, available in the office, to the Principal under the following circumstances.
 - a. Absence for the classes over two days;
 - b. Absence for tests and examinations;
 - c. Absence on the reopening day, after holidays
 - d. Absence on special occasions declared specifically by the Principal, like College Day, Sports Meet etc.
6. In case of leave or illness for more than two days, the Principal may insist on the production of a Medical Certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner approved by the College before going to regular classes. Under no circumstances medical certificates for earlier absence will be accepted at a later stage.
7. Prior permission from the Principal should be obtained for absence over two days. When this has not been possible because of unavoidable circumstances, the application for leave should reach the Principal at least within five days of absence.
8. The Student's name is liable to be struck off the rolls of the College whenever one is absent from the class for over ten days without prior permission from the Principal.
9. Students are warned that they should get a minimum of 75% of the attendance for each subject, failing which they will not be eligible to appear for University examination or for promotion to the next higher class. The Principal will not recommend applications for condonation of attendance if the absence, in his opinion, cannot be justified.

Provision has been made for announcing shortage of attendance in each subject at the end of the four quarters of the academic year on the College notice board. Parents also will be informed through the ward, through a warning letter acknowledged by the ward. However, non-receipt of information is not a valid reason for claiming attendance.
10. Parents are advised to get the information through their wards or enquire in the College office periodically.

14. Leave Notes

1. If the absence is only for one hour, the student will seek written permission from the concerned lecturer.
2. If the absence is for more than one hour and upto two days, leave will be sanctioned by the Academic Advisor only.
3. If the absence is for three days or more, the parent's signature must invariably be obtained, and the leave will be noted or sanctioned by the Principal. (Separate application form available in the office is to be used.)

However, in all the above cases, the leave note should be signed by the Parent / Guardian.

15. Student Welfare Officer

The college has appointed two student welfare officers to supervise and guide the students in their activities. He/she is also incharge of students - Grievance Cell, which assists them to redress their grievances. Moreover, an experienced counsellor too, visits the college regularly.

MANGALORE UNIVERSITY

Regulations Governing Credit Based Semester Scheme for Bachelor Degree Programmes in the Faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce

(Framed under Section 44 (1) (c) of the KSU Act 2000)

The Salient Features of the Credit Based Semester Scheme:

- a) Each course shall carry certain number of credits.
- b) The degree programmes are structured on semester basis.
- c) The subjects of study include foundation courses, general studies and interdisciplinary subjects.
- d) The students are required to take part in co-curricular and extra curricular activities and their participation is compulsory as a part of the credit based system.
- e) The declaration of result is based on the aggregate percentage of marks obtained as well as on Grade Point Average earned.

1. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMMES:

The duration of Bachelor Degree Programmes shall extend over six semesters (three academic years) of 16 weeks each. Each semester shall consist of 16 weeks of study (excluding the time spent for the conduct of final examination of each semester).

2. MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAMME:

The maximum period for completion of a degree / diploma programme shall be double the duration stipulated for programme (excluding the internship) reckoned from the year of admission (inclusive of the year of admission) to the programme. However, in the case of one and two year programmes, the maximum period for completion shall be three and five years respectively.

A candidate who fails to complete the programme within the prescribed maximum period, he/she shall be permitted to take the examination subject to the following conditions :

- a) He/She shall write the examination as per the existing syllabus for the programme / course / paper/s.
- b) If the programme / course / subject / paper/s is changed / discontinued, he/she shall be permitted to write the examination in the prevalent programme / course / paper/s or equivalent programme / course / paper/s as decided by the Equivalence Committee.
- c) He shall pay a special examination fee prescribed by the University from time to time.
- d) These rules shall also be applicable to programmes / courses where there is provision for improvement.

(Assented by the Chancellor on 16.4.2008)

3. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction and examination shall be English/Kannada.

4. SUBJECTS OF STUDY:

Subjects of study shall comprise the following :

4.1 GROUP- I: LANGUAGES:

The candidate shall opt for General and Communicative English as compulsory subject and one of the languages listed below:

(a) Kannada, Sanskrit, Hindi

(b) In addition to General and Communicative English, a candidate shall opt for any one of the two languages studied at the Pre-University or equivalent level. However, he/she may opt for Kannada even if it is not studied at the Pre-University or equivalent level. With the permission of the University a candidate may opt for any other language listed above even if he/she has not studied that language at the Pre-University or equivalent level.

4.2 COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS

- a) A candidate shall opt for not more than two languages under optionals.
- b) A candidate opting for Chemistry as an optional subject shall also opt for Mathematics and Physics.
- c) A candidate opting for Computer Science as an optional subject shall also opt Physics and Mathematics.
- d) A candidate opting for Chemistry as an optional subject shall also opt Botany and Zoology as optional subject.

4.3 Group III :

a) Foundation Courses (Common for all courses): (i) Constitution of India and (ii) Human Rights, Gender and Environmental Studies shall be as compulsory subjects, alternately, in the first and second semesters.

b) General Studies: It shall be studied as compulsory subject in the III semester of B.A./B.Sc. degree programmes.

c) Interdisciplinary Subjects: Computer Applications or Human rights as prescribed by the University shall be studied in the IV semester of BA/B.Sc. degree programmes.

d) An Interdisciplinary Subjects which a student opts for shall be other than those studied under optionals.

4.4 Co & Extra Curricular Activities:

A student shall opt for any one of the following activities in the first four semesters offered in the college :-

A) N.S.S. / Youth Red Cross

B) Sports and Games

- C) Other Extra-Curricular Activities as prescribed by the university.
Evaluation of Co & Extra Curricular Activities is as per the procedure evolved by the university from time to time.

5 ATTENDANCE :

A candidate who does not satisfy the requirement of attendance even in one subject shall not be permitted to take the whole University examination of that semester and he/she shall seek re-admission to that semester in a subsequent year.

6. MINIMUM FOR A PASS:

- 6.1 No candidate shall be declared to have passed the Semester Examination as the case may be under Group I / Group II / Group III (except in Co. and Extra curricular activities) unless he/she obtains not less than 35% marks in written examination and 35% marks in the aggregate of written examination and internal assessment put together in each of the subjects, 35% marks in written examination (for subjects with practicals) and 35% marks in Project work & viva wherever prescribed.
- 6.2 If a candidate fails in any subject, either in theory or in practicals, he/she shall appear for that subject only at any subsequent regular examination, within the maximum period prescribed for completing the programme. He/she must obtain the minimum marks for a pass in that subject (theory and practicals separately) as stated in para (6.1) above.

7. CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES:

The results of successful candidates at the end of VI semester shall be classified on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in all the six semesters and the aggregate Grade Point Average (GPA).

7.1 Declaration of Class on the basis of Percentage of Aggregate Marks:

First Class with Distinction	70% and above
First Class	60% and above but less than 70%
High Second Class	55% and above but less than 60%
Second Class	50% and above but less than 55%
Pass Class	35% and above but less than 50%

- 7.2 The candidates who pass all the semester examinations in the first attempt in three years are eligible for ranks provided they secure 60% and above marks or at least an A grade.
- 7.3 A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible for only class and not for ranking.

16. Internal Assessment Marks :

1. The internal assessment marks shall be based on two tests or one test and one assignment and Paper presentation/Seminar/Project/G.D. etc. The average of the two shall be taken as the internal assessment marks.
2. The marks of the internal assessment shall be published on the notice board of the college for information of the students.
3. There shall be no minimum in respect of internal assessment marks.
4. Internal assessment marks shall be shown separately in the marks card. A candidate, who has failed or rejected the results, shall retain the internal assessment marks.

17. MEDICAL EXAMINATION :

Students are required to attend the medical examination as per the regulations of the university. They must report to the doctor on the prescribed dates. Medical test for female students is Conducted by a lady doctor.

18. Issue of Certificates :

1. Transfer and all other certificates shall be issued only on payment of all the fees and other dues to the College by the student. Two term fee should be paid if the student has attended any of the classes for any day during the term.
2. Transfer and other Certificates, in the case of a student who withdraws from the institution at the end of the First Year/Second Year course, will be issued only after the declaration of the result of University Examinations.
3. The official Conduct Certificate is a document which a student has to earn by his conduct and behaviour during his College course and it shall be issued to him only by the Principal. It will not be issued as a matter of course, and the Principal may refuse the Conduct Certificate to any student whose conduct, in his opinion, has not been satisfactory.
4. Pass Certificate of University Examinations will be issued by the University on application to the Registrar Evaluation after payment of the prescribed fee.

19. Academic Advisor :

1. The tutorial system in the College is organised with a view to develop effectively the student-teacher relationship on an intimate, mutually helpful and co-operative basis.

2. Each student is placed under the charge of an Academic Advisor. About 25-30 students are assigned to each Academic Advisor.
3. The students are encouraged to take their Academic Advisors as their local guardian within the College. They should meet their Academic Advisors as often as possible within the College and discuss with them freely and frankly all their problems connected with the College and their studies.
4. The parents of students are also advised to contact the respective Academic Advisor at least once a term to know the attendance and progress of their wards.
5. The report about each student will be submitted to the Principal by the respective Academic Advisor every term. Leave application by the student should be submitted through them. A progress report will be sent to the parents at the end of the First and the Second term by the respective Academic Advisors.

20. Academic Prizes :

- A. All rank holders in the University Examinations.
- B. General Proficiency Prizes based on University Examinations : Only the student who obtains the highest aggregate of marks in the University examination is entitled to a prize subject to the following conditions.
 1. He should have passed in all the subjects.
 2. The aggregate marks obtained by the candidate should not be below 50%.
- C. Subject Proficiency Prizes based on University Examinations - Student fulfilling the following conditions is eligible :
 1. He should have passed in all the subjects.
 2. He should secure not less than 50% in the particular subject.
- D. Prizes for outgoing students based on the Final Year University Examinations.
- E. Students who have scored highest marks in the qualifying examination and discontinued their studies in the college are not eligible for endowment prizes.

Note : Good conduct and attendance are requisite conditions for obtaining a prize. If the one who obtains the highest marks fails to fulfil this condition, it is left to the discretion of the Principal to award the prize to the next in merit.

22. Library Rules :

1. Library will be kept open from 9-00 a.m. to 5.00p.m. on all working days and from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. during vacation.
2. Readers shall maintain strict silence within the library premises.
3. Newspapers and magazines will not be issued to students.
4. Marking with pen or pencils on the books of the library is strictly forbidden.
5. Each student will be issued one borrower's ticket which entitles him to borrow one book at a time, and the ticket will have to be returned to the Librarian at the end of the year.
6. If the ticket is lost, the fact must be immediately reported to the Librarian and a duplicate ticket will be issued after paying a penalty fee of Rs.10/.
7. Application for books should be submitted before 10.45 a.m. on the day of the issue of books.
8. The timings for issue and return of books are as follows :

Return of books

9-00 a.m. to 11-00 a.m.

Issue of books

3-15 p.m. to 5-00 p.m.

9. A book may generally be kept for one week, and the due date will be stamped on the due date slip. In case the due date falls on a holiday, the book shall be returned on the next working day. The book may, however, be renewed for another week, if there is no other application for the same.
10. A student, who fails to return the book on the due date will be fined Re.1.00 per book per day.
11. If a book is not returned to the library within a month, the matter will be reported to the Principal.
12. Books lost, torn, defaced, marked or damaged in any way shall have to be replaced by the borrower along with the fine as fixed by the Principal.
13. Books from the reference section will be issued to students at 4-30p.m. each day, and will have to be returned to the library on the next day before 9.30 a.m.

14. A book may be reserved for a reader provided he makes an application to the Librarian for the same before 10 a.m. The book should be collected within 24 hrs. after the Librarian informs that the book is available.
15. Students should note that the Library must not be used as a common room and must be made use of only for the purpose of study. Any misbehaviour of the students inside the Library will be reported to the Principal by the Librarian and he/she will not be given any Library facility until he/she gets Principal's permission.
16. Books will be issued on all days to all the students except Saturday against Borrowers Card from 9.00 a.m. to 11.00 a.m.
Books against identity card will be issued from 11.00a.m. to 4.00p.m.
17. Any book lent out may be recalled by the Principal at any time even before the due date of returning.

23. Book Bank :

Standard text-books on different subjects will be lent to deserving students under the Book Bank Scheme of the College. Only one book will be issued per student which may be retained by him/her till the issue of admission tickets. However, books can be retained against deposits as fixed by the librarian.

24. Students Insurance Policy :

All the bonafide students of this institution and the members of the staff come under "Insurance Policy". The premium, towards the same is paid by the College from Parent-Teachers' Association fund.

In case of an accident, resulting in minor injuries, the compensation will be the expenses incurred by the person in a hospital or Nursing home but not exceeding Rs. 500/-. To claim the same, the person has to be hospitalised for a day.

In case of an accident resulting in loss of limbs, eyes, ears etc., the compensation will be Rs. 5,000/10,000 depending on the nature of loss.

25. Rules of Railway Concessions :

Railway concession forms will be issued to the following category of students :

1. Students coming from far off places for their journey from home to College and return and during approved holidays and vacation.
2. Students going on educational tours under the care of a lecturer for approved College tours and excursions.
3. For students to participate in games and sports.

26. Students' Council :

The Students' Council plays a significant role towards achieving certain objectives

1. To encourage participation of students in activities
2. To strengthen cordial relation between students and staff.

The Students' Council is guided by the Student Welfare Officers

3. Membership of these Associations is open to all students of the College who desire to participate in these activities.

The Students' Council of the college consists of all the Class representatives and Secretaries and Joint Secretaries of all the associations. The office bearers are elected by the students in a democratic way. The rules regarding the conduct of election will be notified by the Principal and such rules are binding on all concerned.

27. Add-on courses :

Add-on courses are offered to students to enable them to acquire additional knowledge and skills in different spheres of study. (Remedial coaching classes for the academically weaker students will be conducted)

28. National Service Scheme :

The college has two NSS units having 200 volunteers. NSS being a two-year course, the First Degree students may be preferred with a view that those students may have better opportunities to devote themselves to the cause of NSS.

The students who have completed two years under NSS shall not be continued.

NSS Certificates will be issued by the University to the students on successful completion of two-year course.

29. Games & Sports :

The College provides for outdoor games like Cricket, Ball Badminton, Foot-Ball, Basket -Ball, Kabbadi, Volley ball, Tennis, Hand-ball & Athletics, Gym. In addition, facilities are provided for indoor games like table-tennis, chess and carroms, Badminton, Weight lifting, Power lifting, best physique. Intramural competitions are conducted in the above mentioned events. Athletic events are being conducted during the Annual Sports Meet.

30. College Wall Magazine and Mangala - College Annual :

'Mangala' - College Wall Magazine is a weekly bulletin published under the guidance of a staff member and a student editorial committee. The purpose of wall magazine is to give scope for the expression of talents of the students. Students are invited to contribute essays, poems, short stories, articles, drawings and paintings which are scrutinized by the editorial committee before publication. Selected articles will be recommended for the College annual "Mangala".

31. Alumni Association :

Alumni Association of the College consists of all former students and graduates of the College who, on paying the prescribed subscription fee, become life/annual members. The subscription is payable by students of the College while taking their respective Transfer Certificates. It is obligatory for every old student to enrol himself as a member of the above Association. A sum of Rs. 50/- will be collected at the time of obtaining marks card. The object of the Association is to maintain among the members an abiding interest in the welfare of their Alma Mater.

32. The Parent - Teachers' Association :

(Rules and Regulations of the Association as adopted in its first General Body Meeting held on October 8, 1983 and as amended from time to time)

1. Aims and Objectives :

- a) To enable the parents of the students of Canara College, Mangaluru, to involve in the educational process of their wards and help to develop the College into an ideal institution.
- b) To facilitate joint efforts by the parents and teachers in ensuring continuous improvement of the curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities as an integral part of quality education imparted in the College.
- c) To chalk out specific programmes and organise specific activities, inside and outside the College, to bring about a healthy participation in the growth of their children and the College.
- d) To collect and deploy resources and to do all such other acts as are necessary for successfully carrying out all the above programmes and activities.

2. Membership :

- a) All parents, of the students on the roll of the College, become Members of the Association.
- b) All members of the teaching staff, the Librarian and the Physical director on the pay roll of the College, become members of the Association automatically.

3.The General body:

All the members of the Association [as in 2(a) & (b) above] together constitute the General Body of the Association.

4.The Executive Committee :

The Executive Committee shall consist of twelve members of whom:

- a) six members shall be parents elected by the General Body at its meeting, two each of whom, preferably, representing parents of students from Science, Arts, Commerce, B.B.M. and B.C.A. faculties;
- b) the Principal of the College, the Student Welfare officer of the College and four other members of the staff nominated by the Principal shall be representing the staff.
- c) In addition, the Secretary of Canara High School Association or the member of the Canara High School Association who is in direct charge of the administration of the College shall be a permanent invitee .

5. Office-Bearers of the Association :

The President: The Executive Committee shall elect one amongst them as the President of the Committee who will also be the President of the Association. The tenure of the President shall be for the period ending with the next annual general meeting.

The Secretary: The Principal of the College shall be the ex-officio Secretary to the Executive Committee as well as that of the Association.

6. Meetings :

The General Body shall meet generally once in an academic year. The Secretary shall issue a circular to all parents informing the date, time and the venue at least 14 days before the actual date of the meeting. If, however, for any adequate and appropriate reason, the General Body Meeting cannot be held as prescribed here, the Secretary shall notify such change in date, time and venue to each parent through a letter giving not less than a clear 14 days notice, the date of the meeting excluded.
