

FEEDBACK OF STUDENTS ON CURRICULUM 2015-16

This is a report on the feedback of students on Curriculum 2015-16 from the 50 responses received on 10 questions. It has been observed that regarding the satisfactory level with the present curriculum 7% found it excellent, whereas, 68% found it good. 16% found it average.

10% have found the learning objectives are clear and appropriate to the needs of the students excellent; 71% have found it good and 13% average.

The present curriculum is well organized and easy to follow is found to be excellent for 10% and 61% good for 23% students.

With regard to the extent to which the present curriculum provides employability skill to the students it has been found to be excellent with a score of 6%; 45% good; 36% average and 13% poor.

13% students have found the extent to which the present curriculum encourages the students to take up higher studies and research excellent whereas, 42% good; 32% average and 13% poor.

Regarding the competency of curriculum to compete in the global employment market 6% alumni have found it excellent, 52% good, but 29 % have found it average and 13% poor.

With regard to the extent to which the present curriculum is helpful to the students to appear for competitive examinations 19% have found it excellent, 75% good and 3% average.

The responses to availability of infrastructure of the college for delivery of curriculum 10% have found it excellent and 68% good but 10% have found it average.

Encouragement to participate in seminars/viva/industrial visit/ model competition have been remarkable with 10% welcoming it, 55% good and 19% have found it average.

Contribution of the curriculum for the enhancement of student personality has been excellent for 6% students; 65% good and 10% average.

From the above responses one could infer that the extent to which the present curriculum is helpful to the students to appear for competitive examinations was considered to be remarkable and outstanding.

However, the responses to the contribution of the curriculum for the enhancement of student personality and encouragement to participate in seminars/viva/industrial visit/ model competition require some attention.



FEEDBACK OF TEACHERS ON CURRICULUM 2015-16

This is a report on the feedback of Teachers on Curriculum 2015-16 from the 34 responses received on 10 questions.

It has been observed that regarding the satisfactory level with the present curriculum29% found it excellent, whereas 62% found it good. Only 9% found it average, and 0% is poor.

21% teachers have found the learning objectives are clear and appropriate to the needs of Students with institutional ideals excellent, 74% have found it good,6% average and 0% found poor.

The present curriculum is well organized and easy to follow are appropriate to the present curriculum is found to be excellent for 21% and good for 74%, whereas 3% found average and 3% are found poor.

With regard to the extent to which, the present curriculum provides employability skill to the students has been found to be excellent with a score of 6%; 59% good; 32% average and 3% poor.

The extent to which the present curriculum encourages the students to take up higher studies and research has been excellent for 12%; 59% good and 26% average and 3% found poor.

9% competency of curriculum to compete in the global employment market found excellent. Whereas 59% good, 32% is average and 0% poor.

Regarding the extent to which the present curriculum is helpful to the students to appear for competitive examinations, 12% of teachers have found it excellent, 62% good, but 26 % have found it average and 0% poor.

With regard to the availability of infrastructure of the college for delivery of curriculum only 3% found it poor whereas, 29% have found it excellent, 59% good and 9% average.

The responses to Encouragement to participate in seminars/viva/industrial visit/model competition47% have found it good and 32% excellent but 18% have found it average and 3% poor.


Contribution of the curriculum for the enhancement of student personality with 29% found excellent, 53% good, 15% have found it average and only 3% poor.





FEEDBACK OF PARENTS ON CURRICULUM 2015-16

This is a report on the feedback of Parents on Curriculum 2015-16 from the 50 responses received on 10 questions. It has been observed that regarding the quality of the subjects included in the curriculum 39% found it excellent, whereas, 36% found it good. Only 3% found it average.

36% have found the infrastructural facilities of the college for the effective delivery of the curriculum excellent; 40% have found it good and 10% average.

Learning resources available in the library/laboratory is found to be excellent for 34% and good for 53% parents.

With regard to the relevance of the course to the modern technologies it has been found to be excellent with a score of 16%; 58% good; 13% average and 13% poor.

26% parents have found the comfort of ward in coping with the workload of the program excellent whereas, 58% good; 12% average and only 4% poor.

Regarding the examination & evaluation system 23% parents have found it excellent, 43% good, but 16% have found it average and 18% poor.

The responses to encouragement in participation of seminars/viva/verbal discussion/industrial visit, etc 27% have found it excellent and 52% good but only 12% have found it average.

21% parents have found the skill developments for jobs & placements through curriculum excellent whereas, 39% good and 16% average.

Contribution of curriculum for personality & character has been excellent for 31% parents; 40% good and 16% average.

With regard to the co curricular & extracurricular offered by the college 39% have found it excellent, 44% good and 6% average.

From the above responses one could infer that quality of the subjects included in the curriculum, co curricular & extracurricular offered by the college and infrastructural facilities of the college for the effective delivery of the curriculum were considered to be remarkable and outstanding.



This is a report on the feedback of Alumni on Curriculum 2015-16 from the 50 responses received on 10 questions. It has been observed that regarding the content of the curriculum 28% found it excellent, whereas, 61% found it good. Only 3% found it average.

19% have found the availability of facilities in the college excellent; 52% have found it good and 26% average.

Teacher's accessibility in the college is found to be excellent for 45% and good for 49% students.

With regard to the effectiveness of curriculum towards post graduation & research it has been found to be excellent with a score of 20%; 64% good; 10% average and 6% poor.

17% alumni have found the examination system excellent whereas, 42% good; 34% average and 7% poor.

Regarding the availability of infrastructural facilities in the institution 18% alumni have found it excellent, 52% good, but 27 % have found it average and 3% poor.

With regard to the present curriculum helps students in global employment market 16% have found it excellent, 36% good and 33% average.

The alumni responses on extracurricular & co curricular activities have been remarkable with 40% welcoming it, 35% good and only 18% have found it average.


Relevance of curriculum to present job or higher studies and personality developmenthave been excellent for 21% students; 48% good and 21% average.





ANALYSIS

The students were administered with twenty questionnaires each for the purpose of feedback on curriculum.

45% of the respondents were of the view that the learning resources available in the library is excellent while 50% felt it to be good and the remaining 5% rated it as average. The quality and relevance in the present curriculum was said to be excellent by 15%, good and average by 55% and 20% of the respondents respectively. 10% said it to be poor.

40% of the respondents agreed that the extent to which the present curriculum has improved their learning is excellent and the rest 60% were of the perspective that it is good. The competency of the curriculum in the global employment market was rated as excellent by 30% of the students while 20% rated as good and the remaining 50% said it to be average.

40% students were of the opinion that the extent to which the present curriculum encourages the students to take up higher studies and research is excellent and 30% felt it to be good while an equal number rated it as average.

The present curriculum helps to cater to the needs of society was agreed to be excellent by 40% of the students and an equal number viewed it as good. 20% rated it as average. 40% of the respondents believed the effectiveness of choice based credit system syllabus as excellent and the remaining 60% rated it as good.

The availability of infrastructure of the college for delivery of curriculum was viewed as excellent by 25% and as poor by an equal number. 50% were of the impression that it is good. Contribution of curriculum for the enhancement of student personality was rated as excellent, good and average by 30% each while 10% of the students called it poor.

40% each of the students were of the view that encouragement to participate in competitive examinations is excellent and good respectively whereas 20% rated it as average.



ANALYSIS ON THE FEEDBACK OF TEACHERS ON CURRICULUM (2015-16)

All the four teachers participated in the survey for curriculum feedback.

Satisfactory level with the present curriculum was rated as excellent by 25%, good by 25% and average by 50% of the respondents while the learning objectives are clear and appropriate to the needs of the students was viewed as good by 75% and average by 25%.

50% rated the present curriculum is well organised and easy to follow as good while 50% felt it to be average. The extent to which the present curriculum provides employability skill to the students was considered as excellent by 25% and good by 50% and average by 25%.

The extent to which the present curriculum encourages the students to take up higher studies and research was seen as excellent by 50% and good by 50% each respectively while competency of curriculum to compete in the global employment market was rated as good by 75% of the respondents and average by 25%.

The extent to which the present curriculum is helpful to the students to appear for competitive examinations was said to be excellent by 25% and 50% rated it as good while 25% said it to be average.

The availability of infrastructure of the college for delivery of curriculum was rated as good and average by 50% each whereas 100% agreed that there is excellent encouragement to participate in seminars/viva/industrial visits/model competition.

25% each rated contribution of the curriculum for the enhancement of student personality as excellent, 50% as good and 25% as average.



ANALYSIS ON THE FEEDBACK OF PARENTS ON CURRICULUM (2015-16)

Twenty questionnaires each were administered to the parents for getting feedback on curriculum.

15% of the respondents rated quality of the subjects included in the curriculum as excellent and 80% found it as good while 5% said it is average.

Only 5% parents were of the opinion that the infrastructural facilities of the college for the effective delivery of the curriculum is excellent, an equal number felt is as good and 40% rated it as average. 50% parents found the same as poor.

55% of the parents answered that the learning resources available in the library as good while 20% felt it to be excellent and the remaining 25% rated it as average. Relevance of the course to the modern technologies was said to be good and average by 30% and 55% of the respondents respectively. 15% said it to be poor.

Examination and evaluation system was rated as excellent by 5% of the parents while 45% said it to be good and an equal number considered it as poor. 5% viewed it as poor.

Encouragement in participation of seminars/viva/verbal discussion/industrial visit etc was considered excellent by 30% of the parents and 45% viewed it as good and 25% thought of it as average 10% respondents rated skill developments for jobs and placements through curriculum as excellent while 25% and 40% said it to be good and average respectively. 20% rated the same question as poor.

The comfort levels of their wards in coping with the work load of the program were good as per 65% of the respondents and average according to 35%.

Contribution of the curriculum towards developing the personality and character was termed as good by 50% of the parents and 45% found it to be average while 5% rated it as poor.

Co curricular & extracurricular offered by the college was found to be excellent by 10%, good by 35%, average by 50% and poor by 5%.



ANALYSIS ON THE FEEDBACK OF ALUMNI ON CURRICULUM (2015-16)

20 respondents were selected for alumni feedback on curriculum.

60% of the respondents felt that the content of the curriculum is excellent and the remaining 40% said it to be good. Similarly, 50% alumni responded that availability of facilities in the college is excellent whereas 40% rate it as good and the remaining 10% pegged it as average.

Teachers' accessibility in the college was rated as excellent and good by 45% and 55% respectively. The effectiveness of curriculum towards post graduation and research was rated as excellent by 30%, good by 40% average by 10% and poor by 20% of the respondents. Examination system was viewed as excellent by 20% and poor by an equal number of respondents. It was rated as good and average by 30% each respectively.

40% felt that the availability of infrastructural facilities in the institution is excellent while 10% rated it as poor. It was considered as good and average by 30% and 20% of the respondents respectively 30% were of the opinion that the present curriculum helps students in the global employment market is excellent and 40% felt it is good. The same was rated as average by 15% and as poor by as equal number

30% agreed that development of communication skill is excellent and 40% felt that it is good. 20% viewed it as average and 10% saw it as poor. Co curricular & extracurricular activities were rated as excellent by 40% of the alumni and good by 50% of them while 10% said it to be average.

30% considered relevance of curriculum to present job or higher studies and personality development as excellent while 40% thought is as good. 20% rated it as average and 10% said it as poor.
