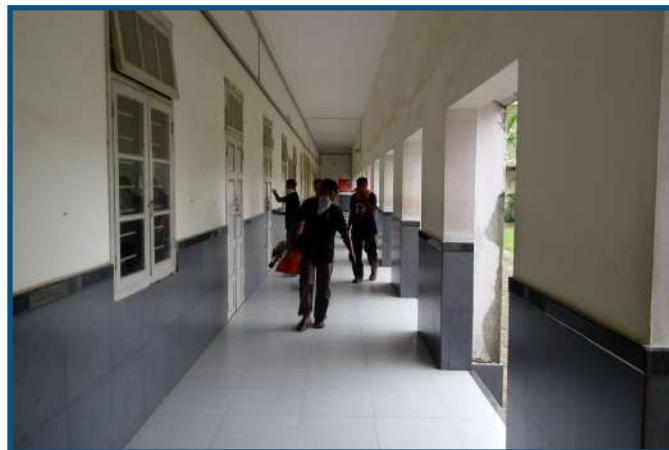


of Business Administration, SKEMA Business School, France, was the workshop facilitator.

Department of Kannada

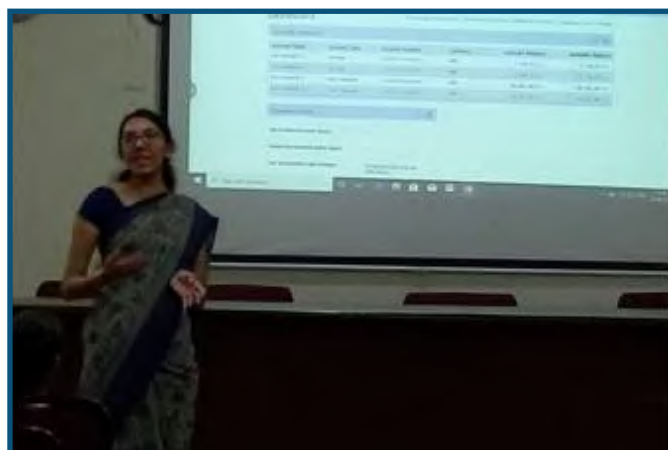
1. Guest Lecture on Sahithya Mattu Vidyarthi

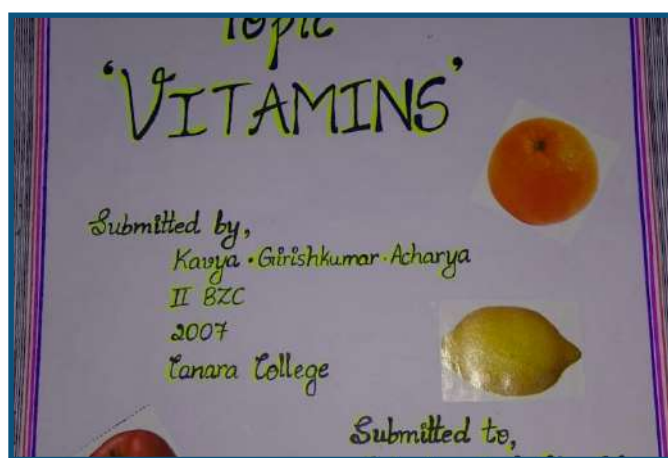

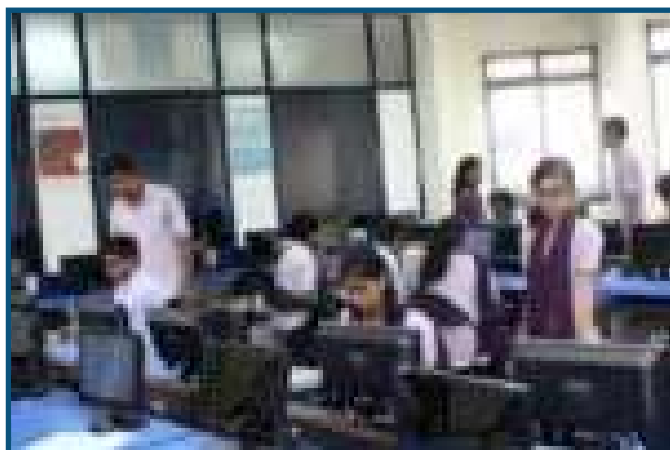

Three day inter class Men and Women's chess competition was organised from September 3, 2019 to September 6, 2019.

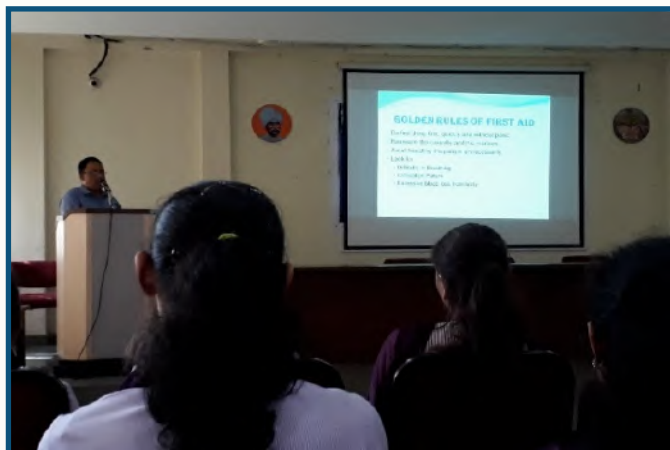
Student welfare mentor Mrs. Vani U. S. and Mrs. Usha Nayak, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce inaugurated the competition.

9. A Session on Rain Water Harvesting

Youth Red Cross society and NSS conducted an informative session on 'Rain water harvesting' on August 27, 2019.

Mr. Kalbavi Rajendra Rao, Project Director, D.K. Nirmithi Kendra, NITK was the resource person. In his session he introduced the various techniques of water harvesting and said, Rain water harvesting is a technique of collection and storage of rainwater into natural reservoirs or tanks, or the infiltration of surface water into subsurface aquifers. Mr. Kalbhavi urged that accumulation of rain water can help recharge local aquifers, reduce urban flooding and most importantly ensure water availability in water -scarce zones.

He also called students as well as conveners to adopt rain water harvesting techniques on college campus. Principal Dr. K. V. Malini, Canara College, presided over the session. In her presidential address she thanked Mr. Kalbavi Rajendra for his informative session.

43 Youth Red Cross volunteers and 114 NSS Volunteers attended the session. Youth Red Cross Staff conveners Mrs. Smitha M. and Mrs. Roopashri K.P. and NSS officers Mrs. Seema Prabhu S. and Ms. Vindya B. coordinated the program. Teaching and non-teaching staff were also present at the occasion.

4. Dengue Awareness Programme and Survey

To create awareness of dengue and encourage as well as provide a cleaner and safer environment. The Youth Red Cross society and the NSS units of Canara College conducted a Dengue awareness programme on July 22, 2019 at Smt. Rathnabai Memorial Hall.

Sr. Reema Shakwa and Ms. Pooja Bangera, Students, the Department of Social Work, Roshani Nilaya, Mangaluru described the symptoms, preventive and remedial actions of dengue to the students. They encouraged students to raise awareness among their family members and neighborhood about the disease. They cautioned students that negligence in getting treated can even lead to deaths.

Resource persons displayed different videos on Dengue and its transmission. They gave a talk about prevalence of Dengue in Mangaluru and residents role in curbing the threat. They also clarified the preventive steps to be taken by individuals at their place of work and residence.

Nearly 110 students attended the awareness programme. Resource persons trained participants to detect the larva of Dengue and instructed students to undertake a dengue survey at various locations of Mangaluru City. With the aim of combating Dengue

disease, students went on a larva hunting drive on July 24, 2019 and recognized as well as destroyed mosquito larva in and off the campus. Through this campaign, major emphasis was laid on preventing stagnation of water, which often becomes breeding ground for mosquitoes.

5. Session on Health and Diet

Canara College Youth Red Cross society conducted a session on 'Health and Diet' on July 31, 2019. Ms. Saaksha, Dietitian, Yenopoya Speciality Hospital, Kodialbail was the resource person. In her informative session she said, "The food we consume and how we make it determines the health of people and the planet, and we are seriously mistaken at the time. The world's diets need to be altered dramatically as millions of individuals have inadequate nutrition, while many more consume an unhealthy diet that adds to premature death and disease."

She shed light on a variety of plant as well as animal based foods in healthy diet as it provides essential nutrition and adequate calories required. She also highlighted the importance of changing lifestyle and food patterns to lower the risks of Polycystic Ovary Syndrome (PCOS), obesity, heart disease, hypercholesterolemia, hypertension and cancer.

42 volunteers of the association were benefitted from this session. Staff conveners Mrs. Smitha M. and Mrs. Roopashri K. P. coordinated the programme.

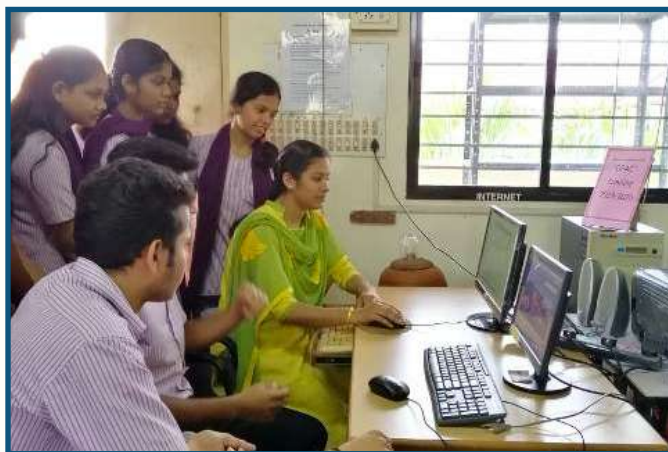
Members of the library committee and other staff, students were present and paid tribute to Dr. S.R. Ranganathan. Students were highly motivated and realized the significance of the day.

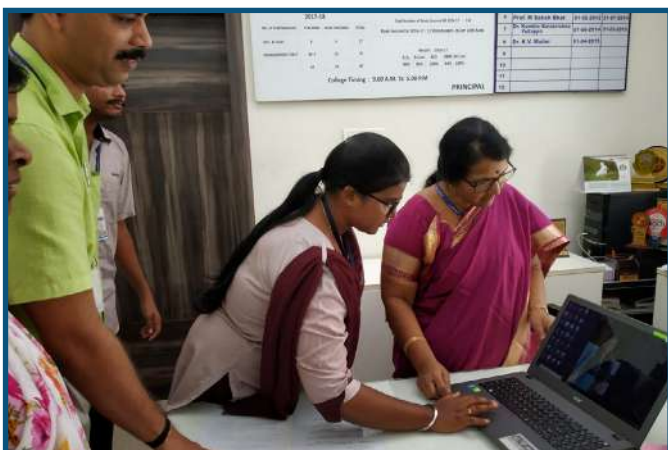
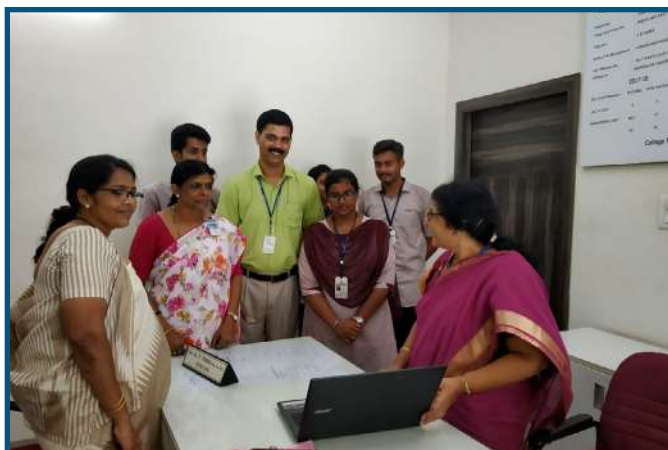

2. Guest Lecture on Women and Human Rights

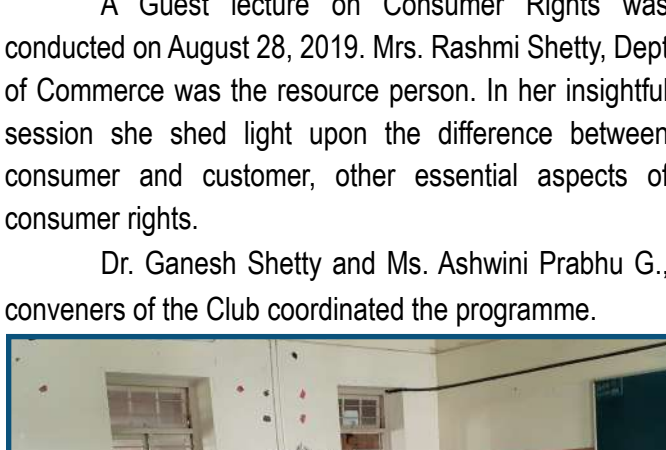
