1. Faculty Development Programme-Effective Learning-Style Interventions

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized a one-day Faculty Development Programme on Effective Learning-Style Interventions on Friday, June 16, 2017 at 9:30 AM, in the College Seminar Hall. Prof. Pushparaj Badiyadka, Principal, Chinmaya School, Kasargod, Kerala, was the Resource Person.

Prof. Pushparaj Badiyadka, while addressing the faculty, said – “we all have a way in which we learn best”. Odds are part of the teaching-learning process. Every student in the class has a different preferred learning style, which can make it difficult for an educator to be the most effective teacher. However, by evolving innovative methods of teaching, a teacher, to a larger extent, can reach the majority of students.

He emphasized that students learn in a variety of ways – by seeing and hearing, working alone and in groups, reasoning logically and intuitively, memorizing, visualizing, modeling, etc... Teaching methods also vary – some instructors lecture, others demonstrate or discuss; some focus on principles and others on applications; some emphasize memory and others understanding. How much students learn in a class depends in part on the compatibility of their learning style preferences with the instructor’s teaching style.

He was familiar with different learning styles, shared the consequences of serious mismatches between learning and teaching styles, learning styles to be considered by the instructors when designing and delivering the course instruction, and so on...

Principal Dr. K. V. Malini in her presidential address remarked that every teacher needs to give more emphasis on class room preparation and build a psychological bond between the teacher and the students.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), through its Staff Welfare Association, organized a half-day workshop on Good and Service Tax (GST) for students and staff on Monday, July 03, 2017, in the College Seminar Hall. CA Gautham Pai, Practicing Chartered Accountant, Mangaluru, was the workshop facilitator.

CA Gautham Pai, while facilitating the session, said GST is a comprehensive indirect tax levied on goods as well as services, subsuming multiple taxes, in line with the concept of “One Nation, One Tax”. Moreover, it is the Government of India’s initiative towards reducing the compliance burden on assesses, increasing the availability of credits which were earlier not eligible, such as the VAT credit against excise or service tax, removing the cascading effect of taxes, bringing in more automation and simplifying the tax structure. He explained the key concepts and narrated the impact of GST on the common man, business and the economy as a whole.

Principal Dr. K. V. Malini in her presidential address remarked that a teacher of any discipline has the necessity to learn about the tax regime of the Nation. This workshop has been thoughtful in realizing the said objectives.

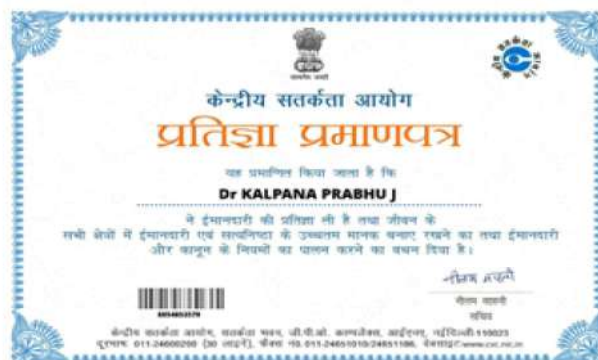

DEPARTMENT OF LIBRARY & INFORMATION CENTRE

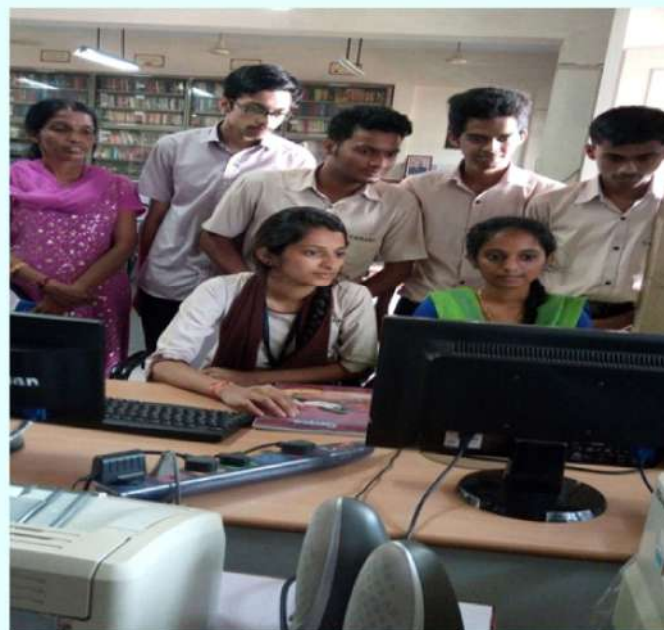
1. Library Orientation

6. Ranganathan's Day Celebration

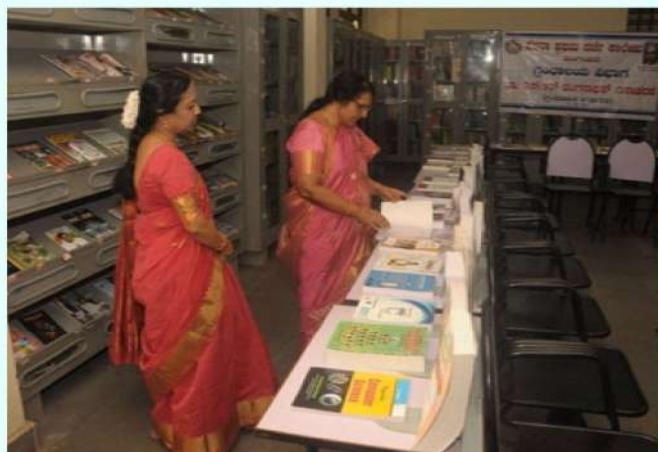
