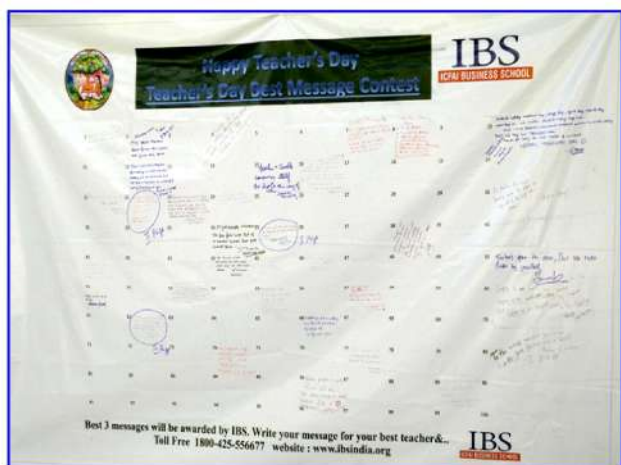

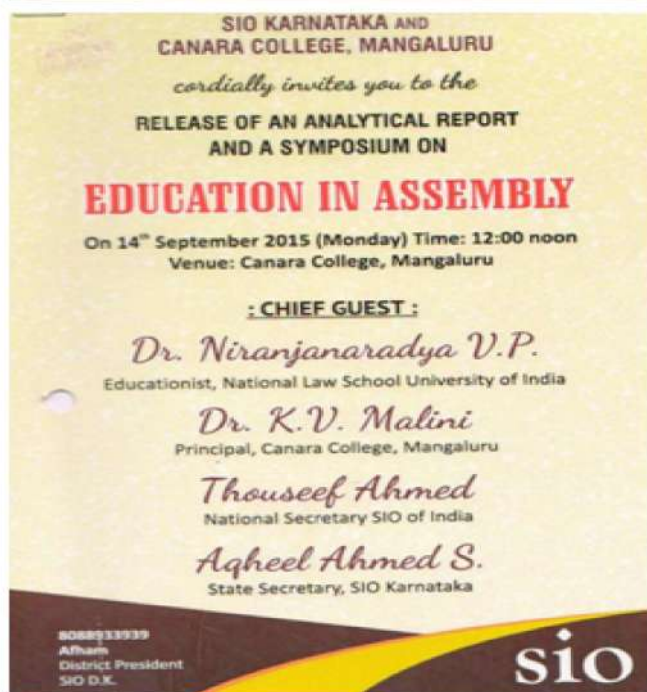

4. Outreach Programme on Basic Physics for the High School Students

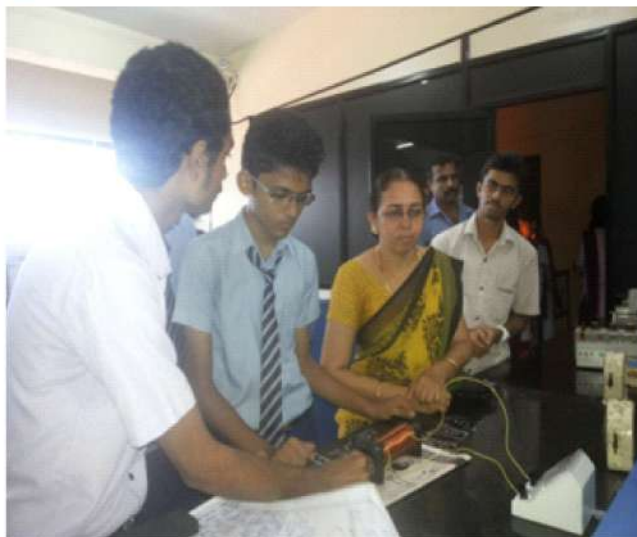
To create and enhance the interest towards Science, Department of Physics, in association with Science Association conducted workshop for the high school students on Basic Physics. The basic concepts in the syllabi of high school are experimentally demonstrated in this workshop.

Students from the final B.Sc. were trained before the workshop by the staff members. They explained

the concepts of Basic Physics effectively by demonstrating the experiments to the students. Nearly 90 students from nearby high schools were benefited by this programme.

The Basic Physics concepts like finding the value of acceleration due to gravity, frequency of alternating current, focal length of the given lens, values of given resistor & capacitor, behavior of transistor and diode were introduced to the students. Phenomenon like diffraction, interference and resonance were also explained. Students presented Power Point Presentation on nuclear energy and Big Bang theory.

DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

1. BASIC SCIENCE LAB 2015-16 PROGRAMME

In order to create interest towards basic science among the school students, a Basic Science Lab for high school students' event was conducted in Canara college on July 29, 2015 in all basic science departments in association with Science Association. 80 students of 9 schools from Mangalore like Canara, Besant high schools attended the programme along with their teachers.

The programme started with an inaugural ceremony in seminar hall. Dr. Usha K.M., HOD of chemistry, university college, Mangalore, was the chief guest. Dr. K.V. Malini, Principal, Canara college, Mangalore and the Conveners, Mrs. Sandhya B. and Mrs. Roopashri K. P. were present during the inauguration. The chief guest of programme delivered a speech about the importance of science in students' life. she stressed on the point in educating the school children as to how to bring in the awareness of studying science. The presidential address was given by principal Dr. K.V. Malini.

The event demonstration started at 10 am after the inaugural function. The students were divided into 4 groups and were sent to Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology labs one by one in a cyclic order to know and learn the experiments.

The students of III PCM & II PCM were demonstrated about 12 Chemical Experiments in Chemistry Lab. The programme ended by 4pm. The feedback forms were given to the students to know their opinion. As per the opinion of students, it was a successful effort in creating interest among students

2. CRYSTAL MODEL MAKING ACTIVITY

DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY :

To bring out the students hidden talents, the department of Chemistry organized Crystal Model Making activity for I. B.sc students on August 14, 2015 in Chemistry lab. The students were divided into nine teams and were guided them to construct models of crystals based on the description of their symmetry. The purpose of the activity is to help the students to visualize symmetry in two and three dimensions, and to identify the relationship between the different crystal systems.

3. 'CONTECH -15' A NATIONAL LEVEL CONCEPT TEST IN CHEMISTRY

The Association of Chemistry Teachers (ACT), c/o Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education, Mumbai conducted a Concept Test in Chemistry (CONTECH) for undergraduate students across the nation to assess the

conceptual understanding in chemistry since 2010. The Concept was held on August 31, 2015 in the college. 91 students from II and III year BSC registered for the exam and 89 students appeared for the same. Students answered 80 MCQ questions. Results for this exam was announced on September 15, 2015. 51 out of 89 students are awarded the certificate of merit from Indian Association of Chemistry Teachers.

1. Extension activity on "Basic Science Lab" for high school students.

Extension activity on "Basic Science Lab" for high school students on Wednesday 29 Aug 2015 was conducted by Basic Sciences Departments in their respective labs. In the Botany Lab III BZC Students under the guidance of Dr.M.S.Joishi Kumble, Head of the Department of Botany and Ms. Madhushree, Assistant professor, demonstrated the Physiology Experiments connected with Photosynthesis, Respiration and Fermentation; Bio-Technology Experiments related to Tissue Culture, Anatomy and Primitive plants slides and Taxonomical characters of the plants.

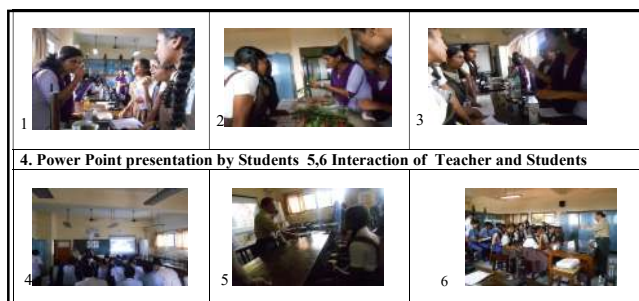
They also explained processes of Fermentation; Tissue Culture, Pollination, Fertilization and Cell Division through Power Point Presentation and Video. Here the



students explained the topics mentioned in the High School Syllabus with additional and recent information.

At the end, Head of the Department of Botany Dr.M.S.Joishi Kumble interacted with the students and made them to understand the importance of Basic Science and future career in Basic Sciences. The Department who visited created awareness amongst the students. Nearly 100 students and 10 teachers participated in this programme from Ten High Schools. 3. Educational field visit to CPCRI Kasaragod.

Educational field visit to CPCRI Kasaragod to Central Plantation Crops Research Institute (CPCRI) was conducted on Wednesday August 12, 2015 under the guidance of Dr.M.S.Joishi Kumble, Head of the Department of Botany and Ms. Madhushree, Assistant professor and Mr. Prashanth, Lab Assistant as an Innovative Practice of the Department.

This Institute deals with various techniques like PCR Technique, Tissue culture, Coconut mills for producing varieties of food items. Artificial pollination in plants is also done here to produce disease resistant and healthy varieties of plants.

Here the III BZC students with their teachers and lab assistant visited Genetic Engineering Lab, Bio-Technology Lab, Coconut Mill, Vermicompost unit and Stores Department. Everywhere the concerned officials demonstrated and explained different processes and functioning of the particular department. This was very informative and useful to students as many things are three in their syllabus.





4. A seminar on Value of Herbs and their Importance in our Routine Life

A seminar on "Value of Herbs and their Importance in our Routine Life" organized by Department of Botany on September 23, 2015 in the Seminar Hall. Sr. Agnes Frank Bs, a Social Activist (fondly known as Anita Sr.) Resource person of the day presented the topic using the Slogan *go green grow green*. Later she illustrated and explained the most common species of medicinal herbs that are found in our gardens, compound, wayside, riverside, and in close by forests through power point presentation and through her own rich experience. She also spoke about the value of useful ingredients in the form of plants that we use in our daily food. She added that it is very sad to notice how we lose sight and neglect to pay attention to these ever green useful and beautiful plants, however rather busy in the world of digital day and night. A balance is healthy and harmonious as plants and trees contribute greatly for our preventive and promotive healthcare.

If we spend little time with plants, taking troubles for good cause by planting at least 25 herbs in each house and providing clean environment, which really prevents us from Dengue, Malaria and other communicable diseases. Some of the important herbs she presented were Tulasi, chiretta, touch me not, goosebury, periwinkle, hibiscus, mint, coriander leaves, lemon grass, betel leaves, hibiscus, coleus, nelanelli, aloe vera, bitter gourd, Brahmi, neem and ingredients like ginger, turmeric, cinnamon, pepper, garlic etc.

At the end of the session many students and staff spent long time clearing their doubts and went home motivated to go green and to be responsible for My Health is in My Hands.

College Principal Dr. K. V. Malini in her presidential speech said that herbs around us play an important role in our life and all of us better to make use of these herbs in our daily life be healthy always. Head of the Department of Botany Prof. Dr. M.S. Joishi Kumble welcomed the gathering. Kumari Lavanya introduced the Chief Guest and Kumari Ananya proposed the vote of thanks. Dr.K.V.Malini, Principal of the college, presided over the function. Ms. Aishwarya Acharya, welcomed the



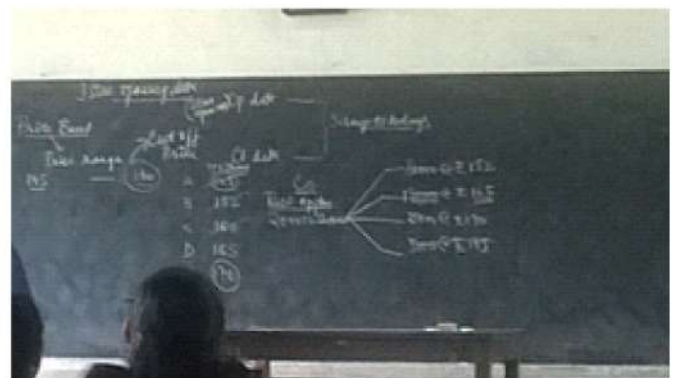
guest and Ms. Sushmitha, compeered the programme. 110 students took the benefit of the programme.

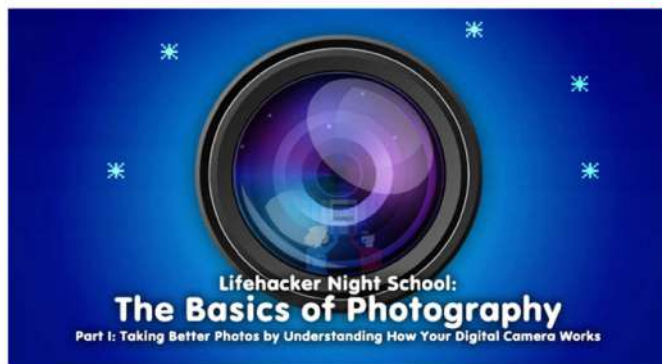
The club was inaugurated on July 01, 2015 in the college. Faculty in charge Mr. Samarth gave detailed information about the association and expectation from students and the club were discussed.

5. SHOOTING MODES

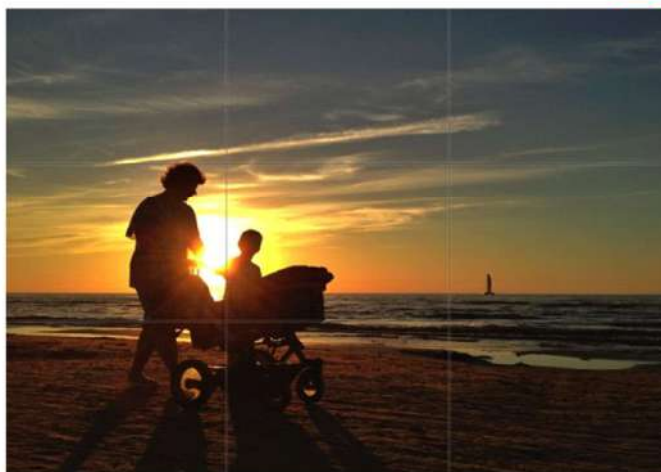

Orientation Programme of the Library was held on 13-06-2015 at T.V. Raman Pai Hall during the Institutional Priventation.

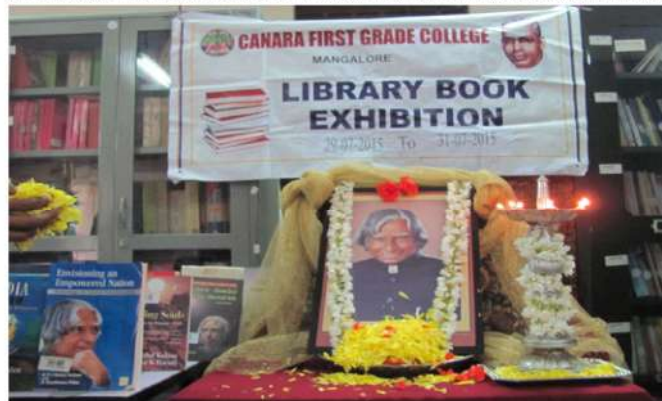

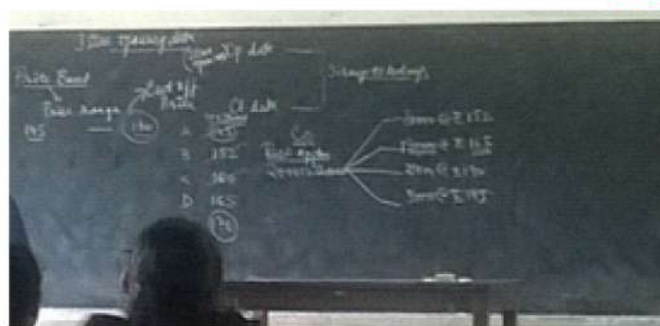

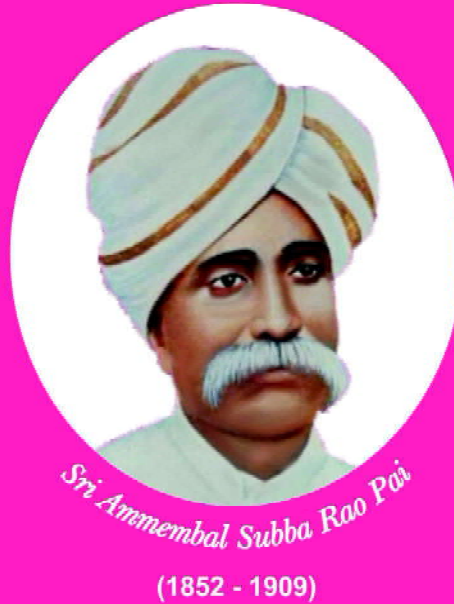
3. Expert Talk on “Management of PCOS”

Our Founder

"A great Founder never leaves memories; rather leaves indelible footprints on our minds"



"He was a man, take him all in all, I shall not look upon his like again". An institution grows in the shadow of the founder. It was on November 19, 1852 a legend christened Ammembal Subba Rao Pai was born at Mulky near Mangaluru. This star went ahead and created a universe of its own which emanates radiance in the form of talented individuals and shall continue to emanate this radiance for time immemorial.

As a boy, Subba Rao was known to be mischievous, mediocre in studies, fond of play, a ringleader among the boys. But he was deeply respectful towards his elders and his esteem for his father amounted to reverence.

A lawyer and a banker by profession, an educationist and social reformer by temperament, he was the foremost among the pre-independence luminaries who shaped the future of Dakshina Kannada District and of the GSB Community. His concern for social uplift gave birth in 1891 of the Canara High School, Mangaluru, the century old precursor to the conglomeration of Canara Educational Institutions of today; while his spirit of enterprise gave birth to yet another national institution, the Canara Bank, in 1906.

Sri Subba Rao's versatility was not confined to the legal profession alone. Along with his professional work in the mornings, the evenings were devoted to social work. He kept himself fully informed about the fast changing world. His zeal and love for mankind touched life at all points. He was deeply saddened at the lethargy of the people towards education and realized that there was no future for the people without widespread general and higher education in professional and technical courses. Because of his enormous efforts, our young men were seen holding high offices both in the Engineering and Medical services at then.

The seeds sown by our founder a century ago have grown into huge tree providing shelter to the society in terms of education, employment opportunities and financial support; thus contributing to the welfare, prosperity and progress of the society. A visionary far ahead of His times and life, Sri Ammembal Subba Rao departed to the heavenly abode on July 25, 1909. Though he shrugged off his mortal remains, he became a living soul and his philanthropic zeal continues to touch the lives of innumerable folks even today...
