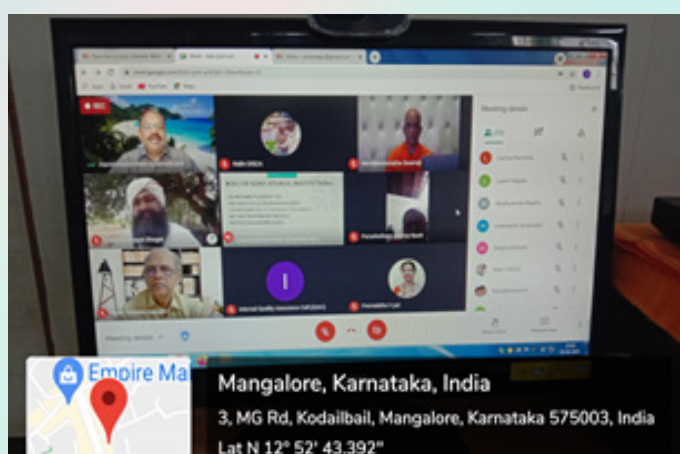
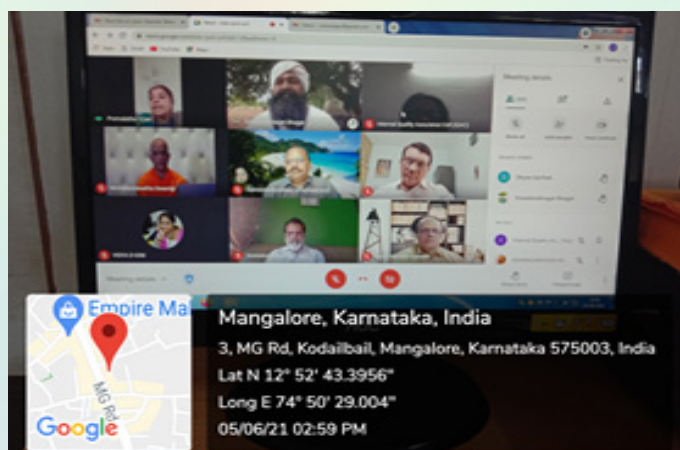

In consonant with the World Environment Day theme 2021 – “Restoration of Ecosystems”, the World Environment Day was commemorated through organizing a webinar on the topic “Role of Educational Institutions in the Restoration of Ecosystems” by Canara College, Mangaluru in association with Sri Adichunchanagiri Education Trust ®, Bengaluru and Organization for Industrial Spiritual and Cultural Advancement (OISCA), Karnataka Chapter on June 05, 2021, at 2:30 PM through Google Meet platform. The programme was also available live on YouTube and Facebook.

Sri Amaranarayana K., Retd. IAS Officer and President, OISCA, Bengaluru Chapter delivered a remarkable Key Note address on the webinar topic. In his address, he said – “Under the destructive impact of human activities and human-made practices, the environment surrounding us is in great danger. Owing to large-scale land, air, soil and water pollution, the environment is gradually losing its vigour.” Further, by citing the environment-

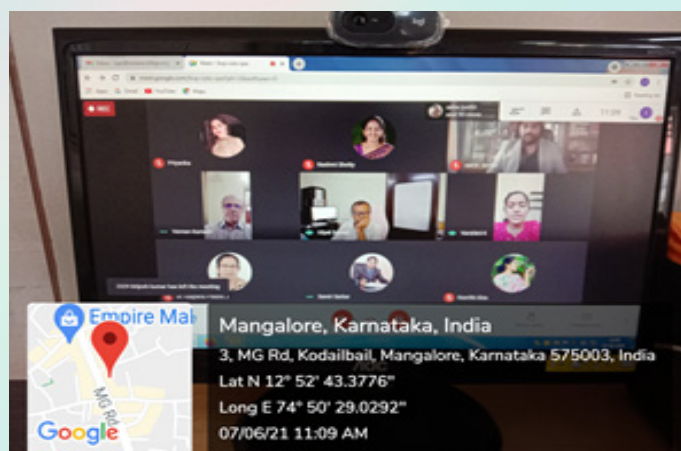
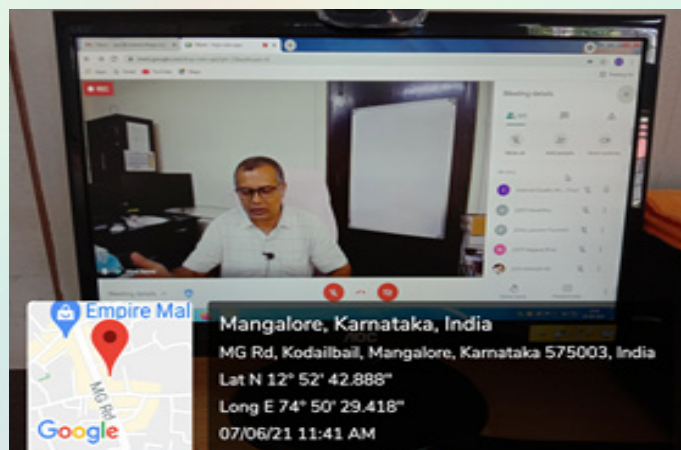

3. Webinar on “Quality Assurance Strategies for Excellence in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)”

Promoting and understanding the idea of quality A webinar on “Quality Assurance Strategies for Excellence in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)” was organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on June 07, 2021, at 11:00 AM through the Google Meet platform.

CA M. Vaman Kamath, Treasurer, C.H.S. Association, Mangaluru in his opening note said “The future depends on what we do in the present. Hence, there is a greater need to reaffirm the individual and collective responsibility towards our Institution at the micro and to our society at the macro level. Further, every great crisis comes with great opportunity, and thus, life-long learning should go on. Continuous improvement in every field is always required. It can thus lead to the improvement of overall quality of the system.”

Dr. Samir Sarkar, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Business Administration and Placement Officer, Gauhati University, Assam delivered the Keynote Address. He said “Quality is a result – the result of being aware of quality but it is more important of being aware of the future. Achieving quality in higher education requires an institution to find a



balance between responsibility for quality and concern for continuous improvement.” His presentation emphasized the facts relating to the quality of research. He also touched upon the issues and concerns about the quality of research, reforms in the research field, opportunities to explore collaborations, Quality Ranking Framework, and the implications of NEP 2019 on these said aspects.

The Key Speaker Prof. Dr. Utpal Sarma, Professor, Dept. of Instrumentation and USIC and Former Director of IQAC, Gauhati University, Assam in his address said “Quality is never an accident; it is always the result of high intention, sincere effort, intelligent direction, and skilful execution; it represents the wise choice of many alternatives. Therefore, the quest to become a quality institution is in itself a core value that HEIs should imbibe and demonstrate in their functioning. The HEIs must strive to address the quality parameters in a holistic approach. Quality, therefore, must become outcome-oriented and not output-based.” Further, he explained the entire process flow of the A&A process and also touched upon the seven criteria of NAAC, illustrating it’s Quality Key Indicators (KPIs). At the end of the session, he also clarified the queries raised by the participants.

Ms. Varshini K., Student, III B.Sc. (PMC) rendered the prayer song. Principal Dr. Premalatha V. delivered the welcome address and also introduced the Speakers to the gathering. IQAC Coordinators Ms. Dejamma A. proposed the vote of thanks and Mr. Hardik P. Chauhan was the Master of Ceremony for the programme.

A total of 70 participants including the faculty, research scholars, and students participated in this webinar.

4. Stakeholders Awareness Workshop on NEP 2020

In pursuance with the directives of the Regulating Authorities concerned, a Stakeholders Awareness Workshop for Students and Parents on “NEP 2020: A Vision for New Horizon – An Understanding of and

Orientation to the Intent, Implementation and Prospects in Higher Education” was organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on Tuesday, September 21, 2021, at 2:00 PM in the College Seminar Hall.

The Principal Dr. Premalatha V. in her opening address said “NEP 2020 is indeed a monumental step and a need of the hour. It is not just about reading the document, but understanding, analyzing, interpreting, and getting a clear picture of it. NEP 2020 aims at filling various gaps between the national and international levels of the education system. Therefore, NEP is a welcome breath of fresh air intending to meet the evolving needs of new-age learning to make India a global knowledge superpower”.

The Keynote Speaker Mr. Devi Prasad, Special Officer – NAAC and Academics, Office of Regional Joint Director, Dept. of Collegiate Education, Mangaluru Region, in his Keynote address said “The NEP 2020 aims to reorient the education system towards meeting the needs of 21st century. Challenges and constraints are quite obvious with the implementation of any new policy. Hurdles in the process of effective implementation of NEP can be overcome with the support of all the stakeholders. Hence, all the stakeholders need to take ownership of the policy”.

The Resource Speaker Prof. Dr. T. P. M. Pakkala, Adjunct Professor of Statistics, Mangalore University, Mangalagangothri in his session said “The NEP 2020 envisages far-reaching transformation in the prevailing education system. The policy endeavours to dissolve disciplinary boundaries that have been creating hindrances in the holistic development of a learner. It is a significant stride towards making education more meaningful, assimilative, multi-disciplinary, and skill-centric. It intends to make pedagogy more experiential, holistic, integrated, learner-centric, giving flexibility to students to pursue their passion at the same time enhancing their skillsets enabling them to become more employable. The substantial impetus placed on vocational education and hands-on learning in



the new policy will give rise to multiple hybrid jobs. The transformational approach from marks-based report cards to a holistic evaluation is a future-ready shift. With several such other standout provisions in the policy, it aims to overhaul the existing education system at large”.

The President of the programme Sri Basti Purushotham Shenoy, Correspondent, Canara Pre-University College, Mangaluru, congratulated all the newly admitted first-year students for having sought their admissions at Canara College. In his presidential address, he said “The NEP 2020 will certainly set the foundation for 21st century India. This policy endeavours to instil among the learners a deep-rooted pride in being Indian, not only in thought, but also in spirit, intellect, and deeds, as well as to develop knowledge, skills, values, and dispositions that support responsible commitment to human rights, sustainable development and living, and global well-being, thereby reflecting a truly global citizen.

This was then followed by a Question and Answer session in which the participants expressed their concerns and queries which were addressed by the Resource Speaker.

Ms. Anusha Shet, Student, II B.Com. rendered the prayer song. IQAC Coordinators Ms. Dejjamma A. delivered the welcome address and also introduced the Speakers to the gathering; Mr. Hardik P. Chauhan proposed the vote of thanks and Ms. Vani U. S., Head, Dept. of Kannada and Student Welfare Mentor was the Master of Ceremony for the programme. The Convener of the NEP Implementation Taskforce Committee Ms. Sandhya B. was also present during the programme. The programme concluded with the National Anthem.

A total of 58 participants including the students and parents participated in this workshop. Besides, Heads and faculty members of various Departments also attended the programme.



5. Educators Awareness Workshop on NEP 2020

The teacher must be at the centre of the fundamental reforms in the education system. Given such an important role to a teacher in the education system, it becomes all the more important to strengthen and refresh the skill base of teachers continuously. Therefore, bringing teachers to the forefront, NEP 2020 endeavours to enhance the professional standards among teachers. With this rationale and also in pursuance with the directives of the Regulating Authorities concerned, an Educators Awareness Workshop on “NEP 2020: Vision to Action – Intent, Implementation, Impact and Implications in Higher Education” was organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on Wednesday, September 22, 2021, at 1:30 PM in the College Seminar for Hall.

The Principal Dr. Premalatha V. in her opening address said “NEP 2020 is a historic effort which seeks to introduce and implement a sea of changes across all levels of education in India. It is indeed a welcome breath of fresh air which has reoriented the focus of education and is trying to move away from rote-learning and memorizing as core practices. Instead, there is a greater focus on testing concepts and knowledge application, and encouraging a more holistic development for students”.

The Special Invitees Ms. Latamaheswari K. B., Principal and Mr. Gopalakrishna Shetty, Dean, Canara Pre-University College, Mangaluru, were also graciously present for the programme. Ms. Latamaheswari K. B. while addressing said “The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is the first education policy of the 21st century and replaces the thirty-four-year-old National Policy on Education (NEP), 1986. It is a framework intended to guide the development of education in the country. The NEP proposes sweeping reforms while focusing on overhauling the curriculum, thrust on experiential learning and critical thinking while bridging the gap between current learning outcomes and those desired”.

The Keynote Speaker Dr. Jayakara M. Bhandary, Special Officer – NAAC and Academics, Office of Regional Joint Director, Dept. of Collegiate Education, Mangaluru Region, in his Keynote address said “The NEP 2020 is a giant step towards the much-needed reforms in the education sector. A whole lot of deep thinking has gone into the preparation of this document with significant and inclusive inputs from all stakeholders. The State Government is making all preparations to implement the NEP. Hence, the Colleges shall very soon receive further

directives and guidelines from their affiliated universities for implementation. Cost-effectiveness and quality consciousness will be the key differentiating factors in determining the sustainability of the HEIs amidst the growing competition in the years to come”.

The Key Speaker Dr. Norbert Lobo, Director, Admin Block and Associate Professor of Economics, St. Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru, in his session said “The NEP 2020 is a welcome move, which will help to propel India's education system in the right direction. It is a progressive policy that recognizes the need of the hour and has certainly made bold and historic reforms towards enhancing the quality of education and improving student learning outcomes. This policy gives absolute freedom to the students to choose the teachers and courses. It combines the futuristic vision for the country with its glorious past. It encourages a multi-dimensional skillset, builds upon traditions and values, focuses on cultural-linguistic diversity and different backgrounds, and emphasizes breaking disciplinary boundaries and pedagogical change for cognitive-affective-life skill development of a student. While there are many aspects still to introspect, the charter is truly a testimony of quality discussion and deep thinking”.

Further, in his presentation, he gave an overview of the new educational structure, shed light on the expected transformation in the regulatory system, effective governance and leadership, the vision of Higher Education, Academic Bank Credit (ABC), 360-degree holistic Report Card, pros and cons of the new system, among others.

This was then followed by a Question and Answer session in which the teachers expressed their concerns and queries which were addressed by the speakers.

The President of the programme CA M. Vaman Kamath, Treasurer, Canara High School Association, Mangaluru, in his presidential address said “For the NEP to move forward, we need robust institutional mechanisms

to support the policy. A great deal of capacity building is required along with creating enthusiasm among all the stakeholders. Unless the Institution and Educators develop a sense of ownership of the policy, the transformation will not take place. We need to move from fixed to growth mindsets to make sense of the new changes. Together, we must strive to realize the hopes, aspirations and dreams of our students to get them future-ready. Moreover, teachers truly shape the future of young minds and, therefore, the future of our nation; thereby implying that teachers have a greater role and responsibility in nation-building by creating a high quality of human resources”. Ms Savitha G. Acharya, Faculty, Dept. of Economics rendered the prayer song. IQAC Coordinators Mr. Hardik P. Chauhan delivered the welcome address and also introduced the Speakers to the gathering; Ms. Dejamma A. proposed the vote of thanks. Ms. Rashmi, Faculty, Dept. of Commerce was the Master of Ceremony for the programme. The programme concluded with the National Anthem.

A total of 60 participants including the faculty members of Canara Pre-University College, Mangaluru participated in this programme.

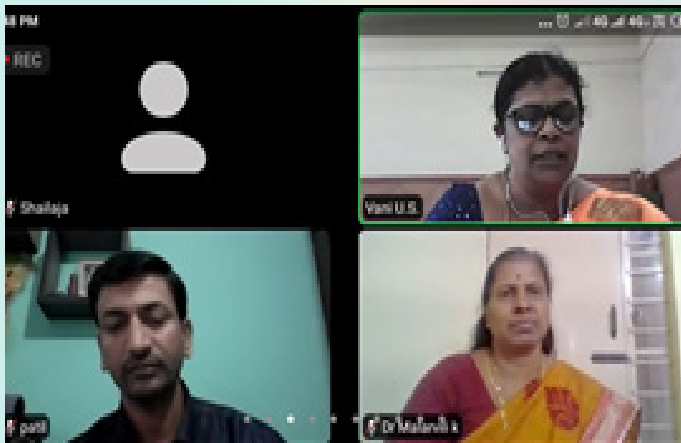
Department of Kannada

The main resource persons of the webinar,



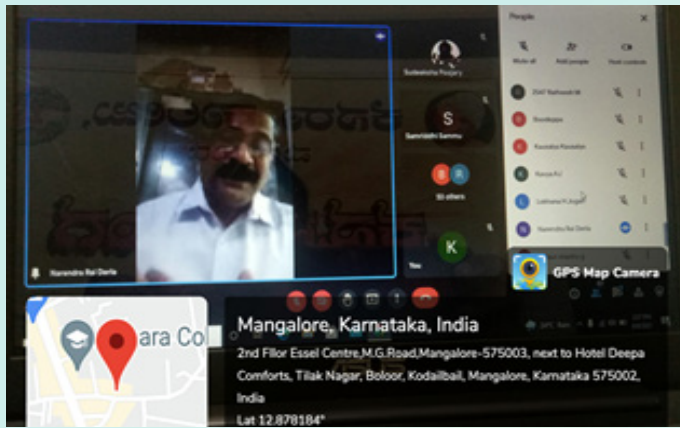

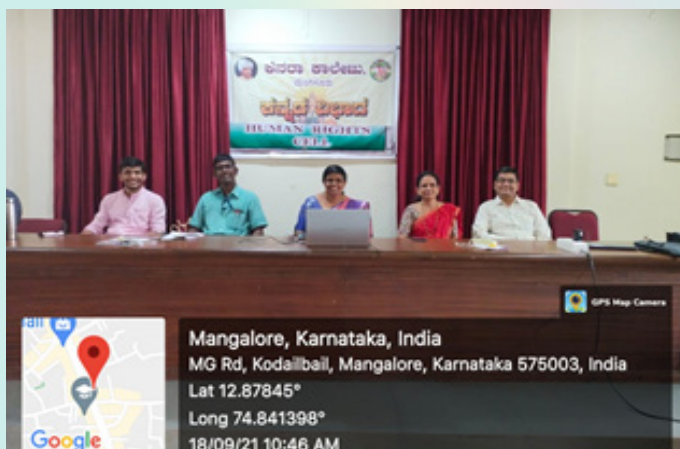

1. National Webinar on "Sanskrit and German - the Linguistic Affinity"

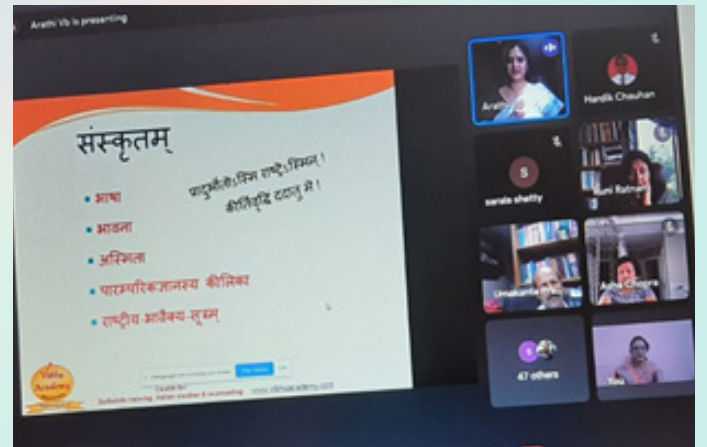
The Chief Guest, Prof. Madhusoodan Penna, Honorary D.Lit., Kavikulaguru Kalidas Sanskrit University,



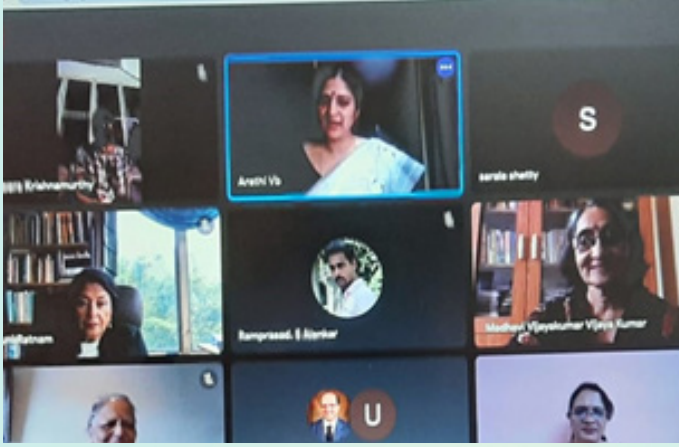

Department of Mathematics

1. CRYSTAL MATH – An Inter-Class Mathematics Fest

The Mathematics Department organised an Inter-Class Mathematics Fest “Crystal Math” for the students of Mathematics of First, Second and Third-year B.Sc. on September 03, 2021. A Google form was created and circulated among the students. A total of 60 responses was received.

After a series of discussions with the Staff- in-charge of the department, Ms. Keerthi K., Head and Ms. Poornima Naik, 5 events were planned namely Quiz, Poster making, Seminar, Speed test and Treasure Hunt. As the participants couldn't come to college and participate offline, it was decided to conduct the entire fest on online mode i.e in the Google Meet platform. A separate WhatsApp group was created for each event and participants were kept updated regarding the event, rules and regulations; and queries were discussed there.

In the quiz event, each team comprised two participants, 9 teams had been registered. There were 3 rounds- the General Mathematics quiz (Google quiz), Buzzer round and Bidding round. The final round changed the entire score of each team and there was a nail-biting fight between each team.

In the seminar event, each participant presented his/her presentation on any Mathematical topic for (6+1) minutes which was judged by the Principal, Dr. Premalatha V., Ms. Keerthi K. and Ms. Poornima Naik. There were a few interesting topics chosen by the participants like, “How we use Mathematics in everyday life unknowingly.” Conducting a Treasure hunt on online mode was a mammoth task. Finally, at the end of the third round, they were asked to gather all the information and identify the name of the Mathematician hiding in it. Few teams solved all the puzzles, but few took time to find the treasure. But the organizers made sure that clues were given to each team at regular intervals so that they could proceed to the next round.

Speed Test, the name itself explains that this event tested the speed and accuracy of the participant. For the individual event, we got 8 participants. A list of 7 Mathematical topics was shared with the participants on the previous day. Conceptual simple, tricky questions were asked to the participants over the chosen topic. Any number of questions could be answered, given the time

limit was 2½ minutes in 1st round and in the 2nd round the time limit was reduced to 1½ minutes. How the participants understood the question and their time management skills were tested.

Finally, the poster making competition had 7 participants, the topic for the poster making was given 1 hour before the beginning of the event. The topic being “Conventional Mathematics v/s Modern Mathematics”. Either digital/chart paper could be used by the participants to make the poster. After which they had to send the soft copy of the poster to the respective email address. But the hard copy of the same had to be submitted to the Mathematics Department after the regular offline college begins.

After the completion of the event Feedback form was sent to the participants, having gotten a great response, suggestions were to conduct many such events in the offline mode. Results of all the events were announced the very next day. Department of Mathematics keeps organising such fests, time and again. Thus, the entire Mathematics Competition ended up making students think about how numbers can rule the world! Altogether 60 students participated.



Department of Botany

1. World Environment Day Celebration

World Environment Day Celebration was celebrated by Department of Botany, in association with Nature Club on June 05, 2021. The focus of these celebrations is towards forming a personal connection between the students and trees through a process of experience, reflection and creation. Students were asked to plant trees and capture photography. Various competitions were also conducted such as Poster Sketching, Collage, Slogan Writing. The



activity has created awareness among students about the need for tree plantation for the protection of the green cover of mother earth. They were also made aware of the benefits of planting saplings, and how it will lead to a greener, eco-friendlier and pollution-free environment. Department of Zoology

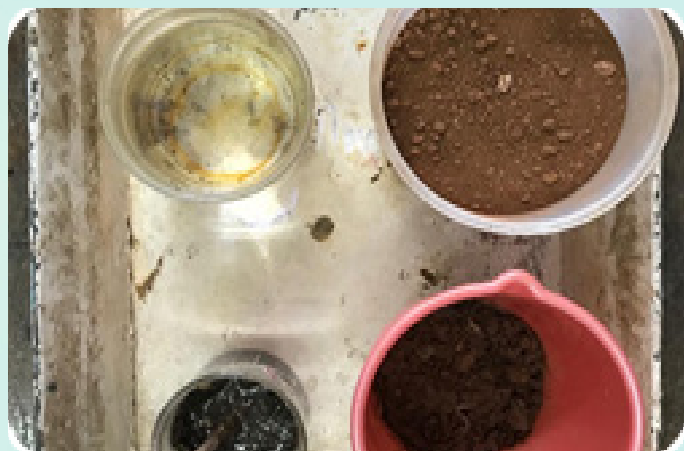
1. E- Quiz on the theme “Ecosystem Restoration”

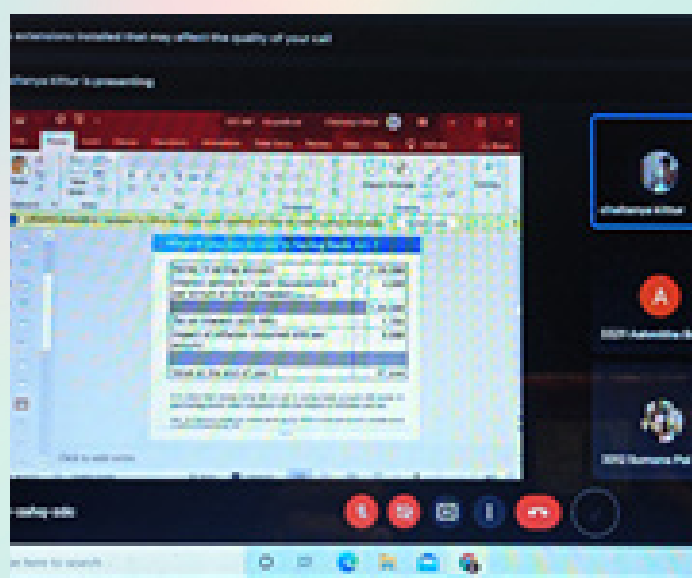
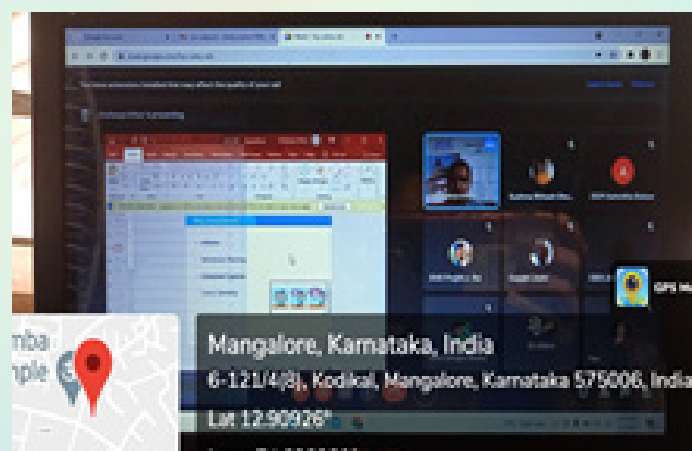
Finally, there was a Q&A session wherein participants put forward their queries and each of their queries was extensively deliberated upon.

4. Webinar on E-waste Management by E-junki

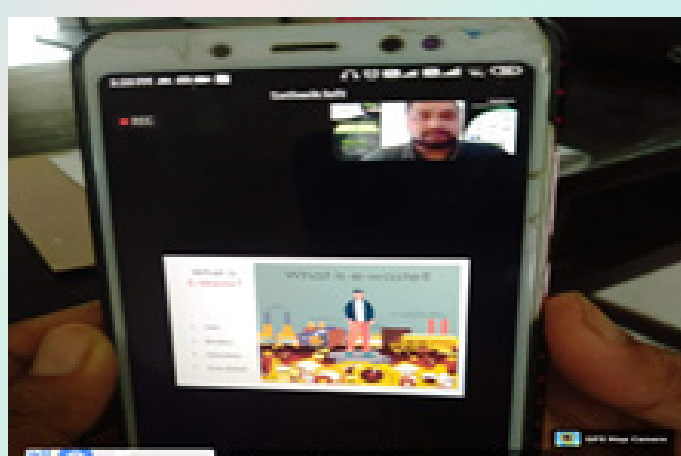
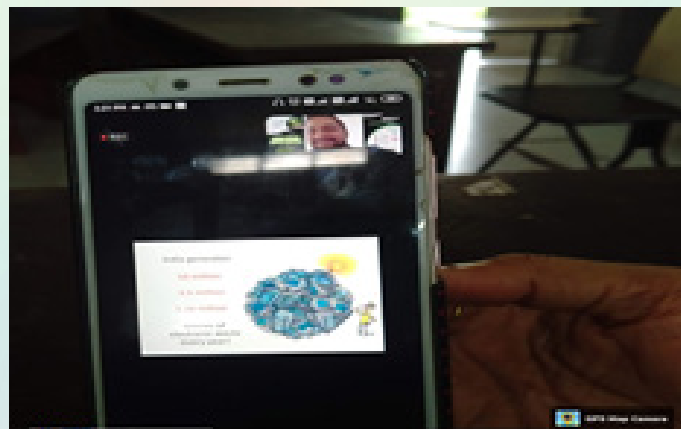
Department of Commerce had organised a webinar on E-waste management was organized on September 08, 2021, for the first B.Com. students.

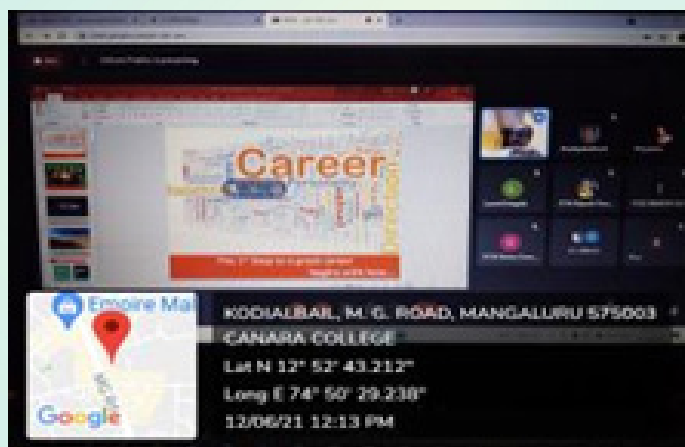

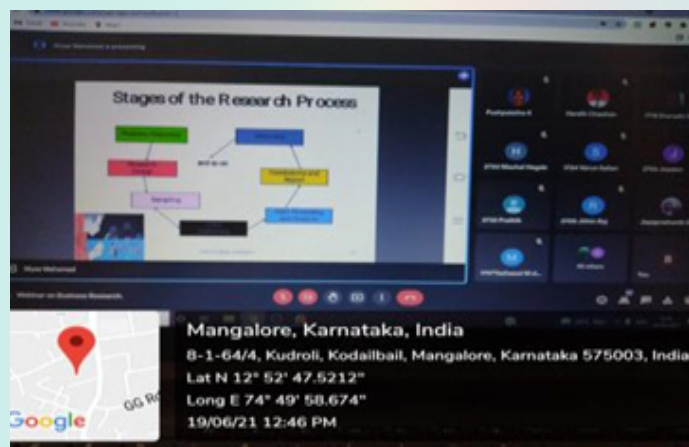
1. A Webinar on “Certified Management Accountants - Career Opportunities & Career Path”

3. Webinar on “Yoga and Health Management”

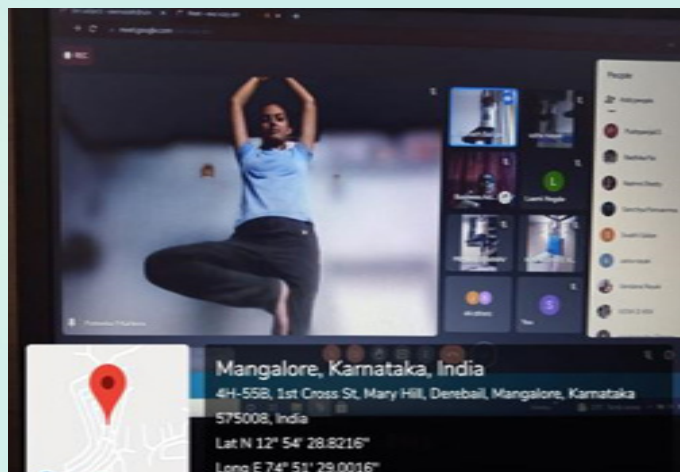

Science Association

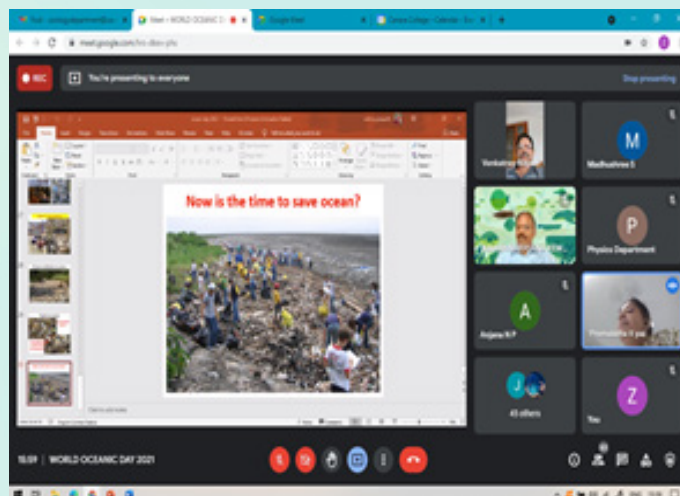
1. World Environment Day Celebration

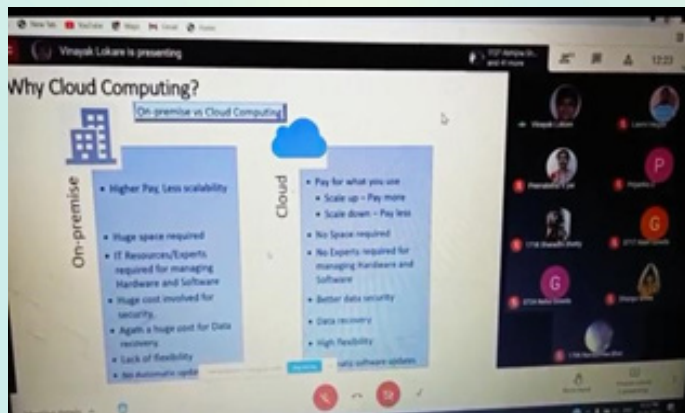
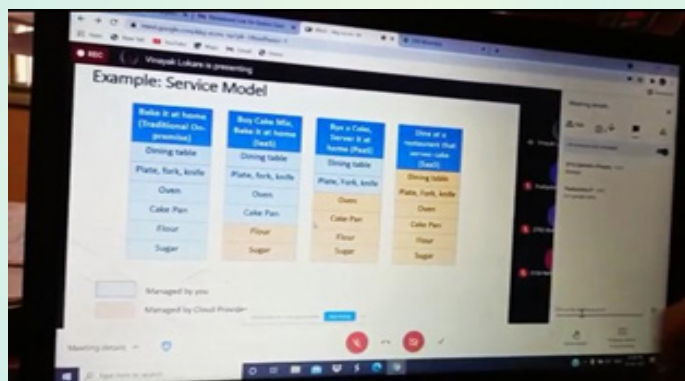

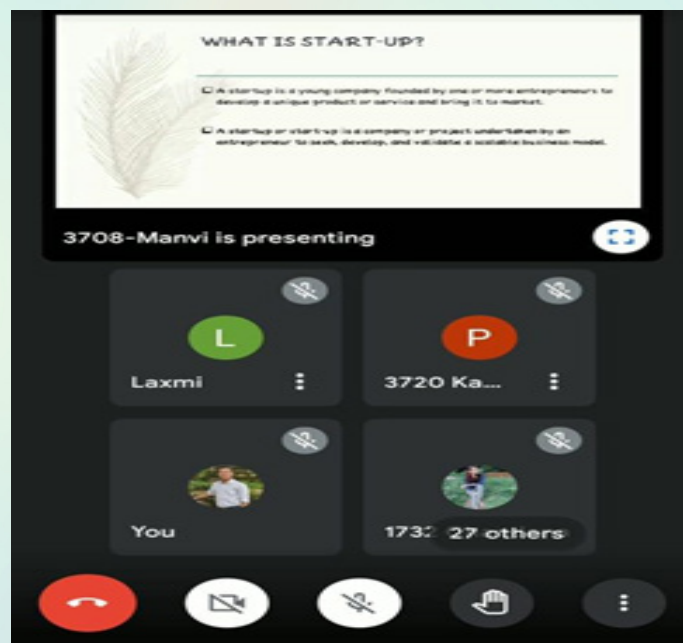


2. Webinar on “Business Plan for Start-Up”

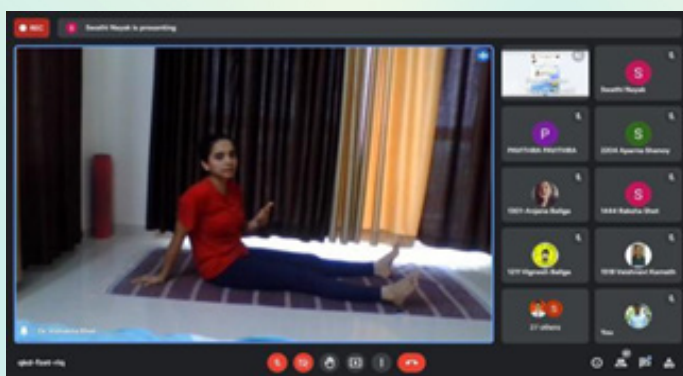
(asanas) to improve physical, mental, emotional and spiritual health.

2. Konkani Manyata Divas

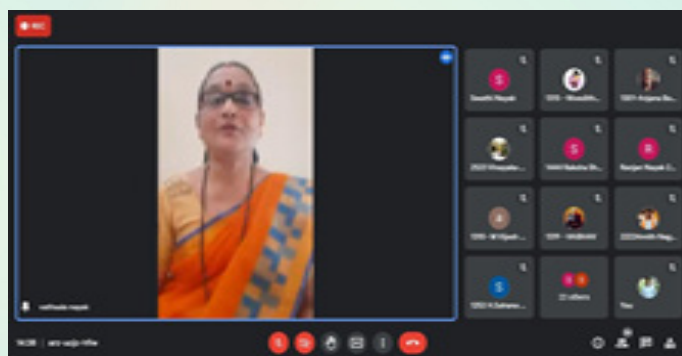
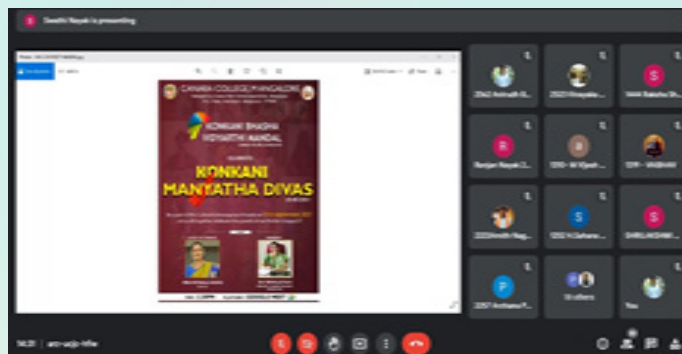

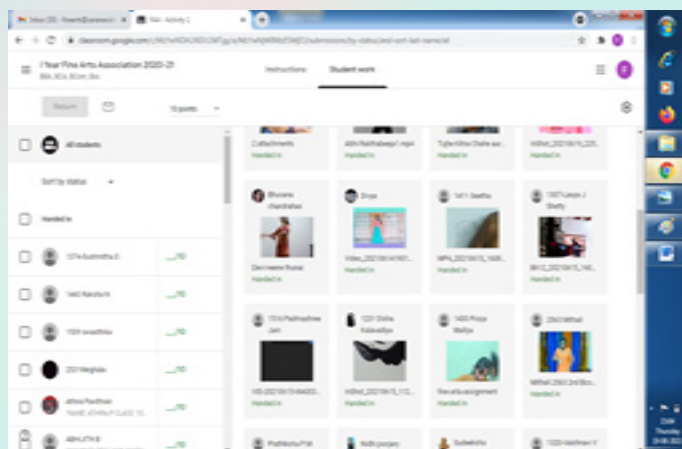

1. Virtual activities - Talent Gallery

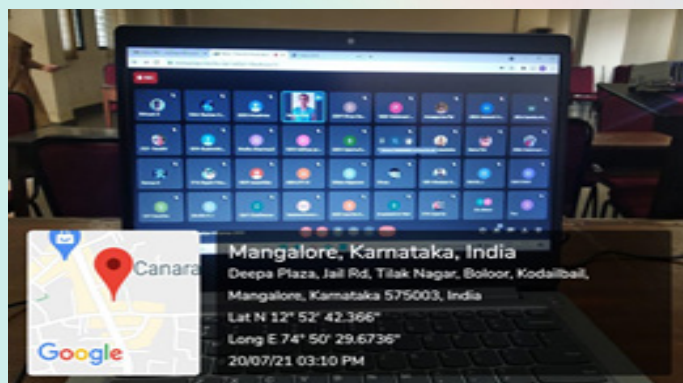
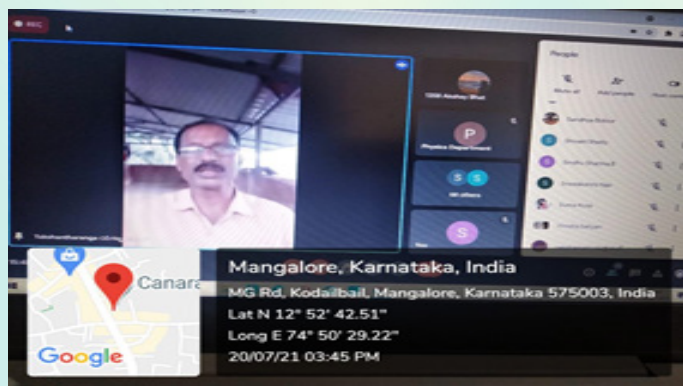

Volunteers came up with innovative posters along with articles and drawing depicting the need for donating blood and saving a life. These posters were converted into a short video which was posted on a social media

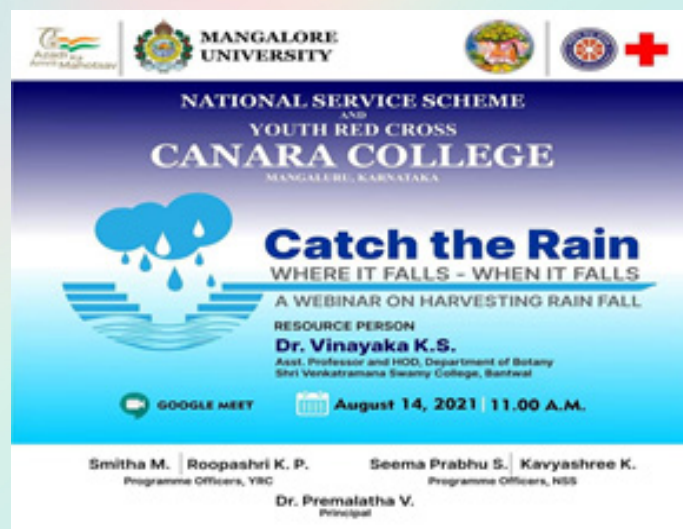


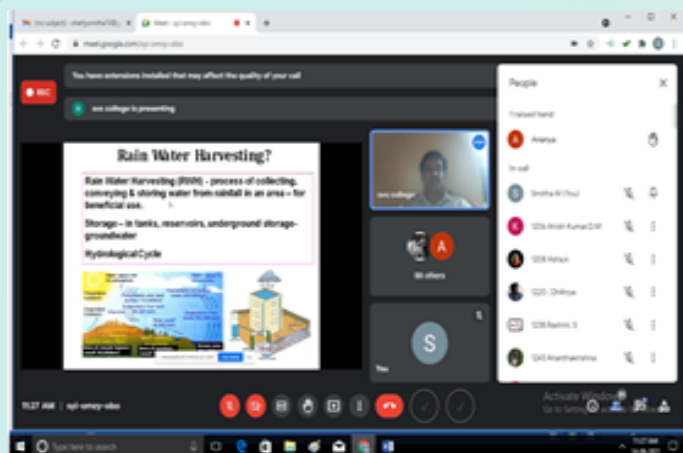

The fourth session on "Alternate Redressal

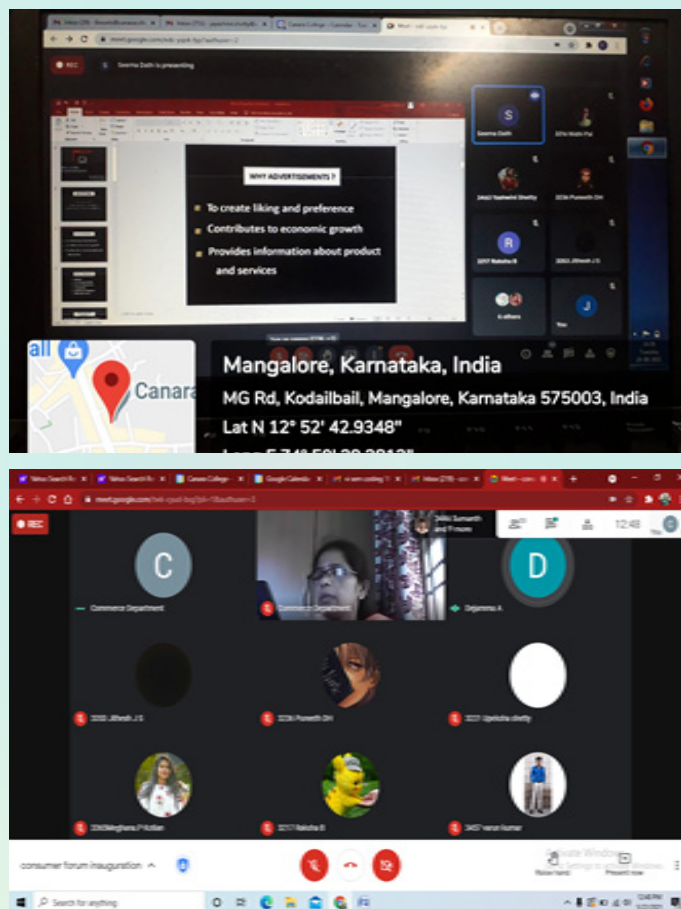

The written examination was held on August 31,



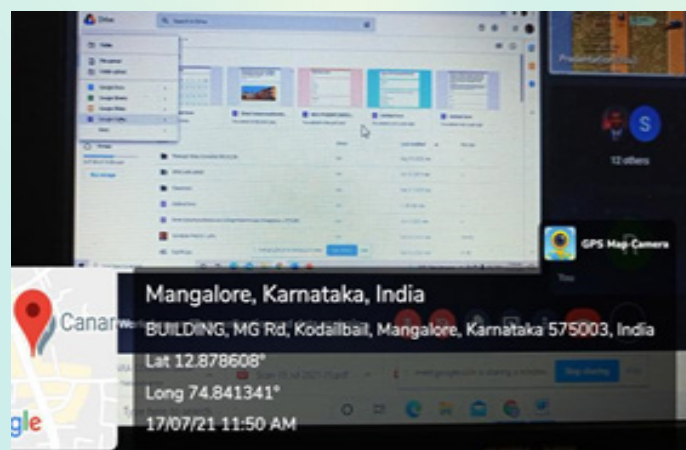
2021, through online mode. The members were assessed based on written test, assignments and their participation in the virtual sessions. Altogether 18 students participated.

1. Workshop on “Data Collection and Data Analysis Using SPSS”

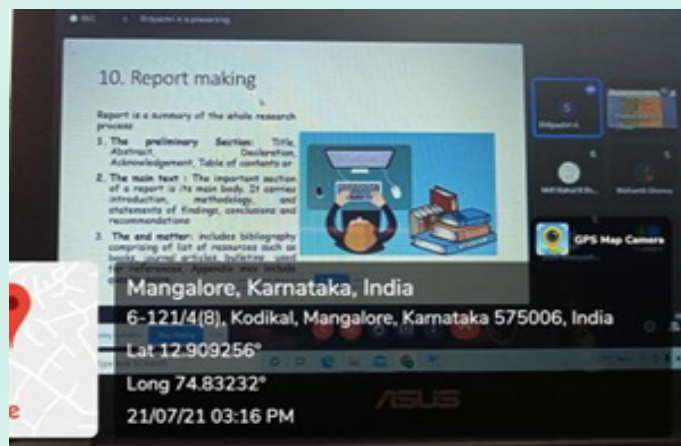

2. Session on “Basics of Research”

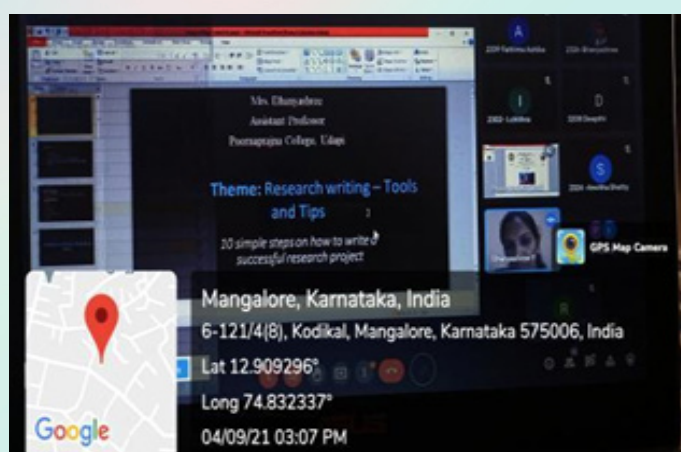

3. Webinar on “Research Paper Writing –Tips and Tools”

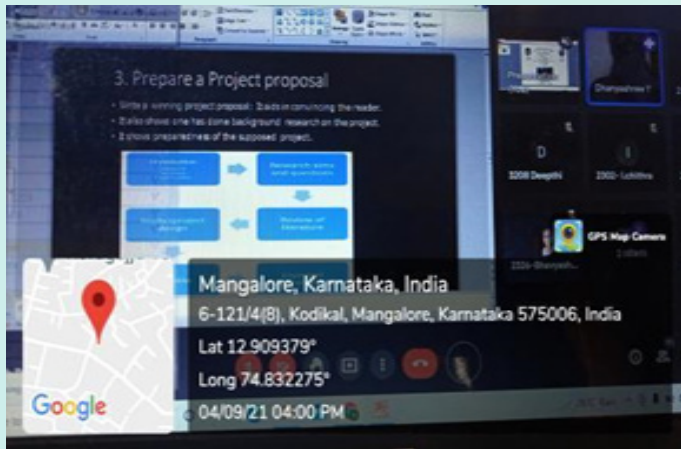
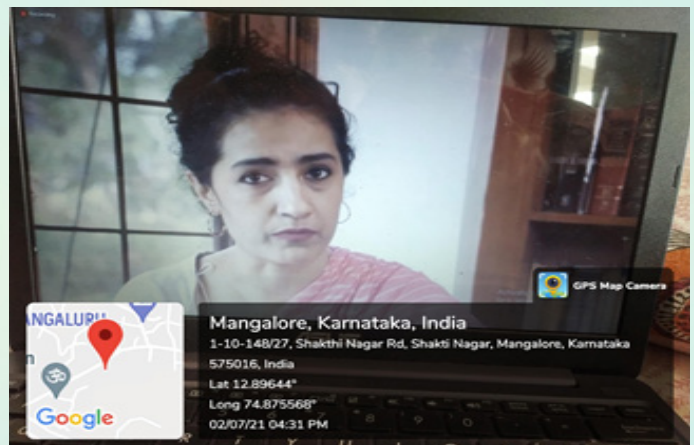

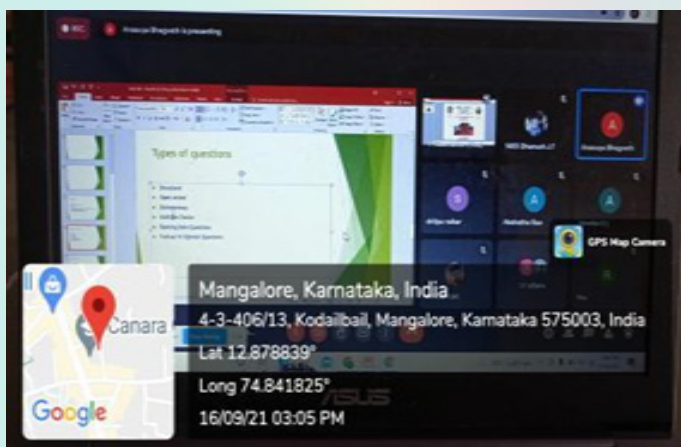
